### Praising the Beyond all Praising

As a musician, I have had the opportunity to be exposed to an incredible quantity and variety of hymns and hymn tunes through the years. The world of hymn music is quite vast and diversified. Therefore, it should never be a shock to find something I have never heard before. At the same time, it is often humbling and frustrating to realize, "That hymn has been there all this time and I didn't know about it?"

A few years ago, one such hymn tune called, "Thaxted," was introduced to me by our church organist, Mrs. Edna Mae McCoy.

From Edna Mae I learned that this beautiful melody was used for the British patriotic hymn, "I Vow to Thee My Country," based on a poem by Cecil Spring Rice. Edna Mae had heard this melody played during the televised funeral services of Princess Diana. Reportedly this was a favorite hymn of the deceased princess. As soon as Edna Mae could get her hands on the music, it became part of her regular organ repertoire.

The hymn melody I speak of was written by the English composer, Gustav Holst (1874-1934). Holst is best known for his orchestral suite, The Planets. When asked to create a melody for the Rice poem Holst discovered that a melodic theme in the Jupiter movement of The Planets happened to fit. The tune came to be known as, "Thaxted," so named after the town in which Holst lived.

The hymnology website, Hymnary.org, lists 15 different texts that are associated with the melody. One of those texts, written by Michael Perry in 1982, appears in our Trinity Hymnal as Hymn #660, "O God beyond All Praising." Perry authored over 300 hymn texts.

Although a neglected hymn; the words and the haunting Holst melody are a perfect combination. The ethereal and majestic nature of text and melody emphasize the awe and wonder of worshiping our great and marvelous God. These are spiritual elements of worship often lost due to intellectualization, familiarity and the sense of routine of which we are often guilty.

O God beyond all praising, we worship You today and sing the love amazing that songs cannot repay;

There is an act of identification or clarification that takes place in the opening phrases. The God beyond all praising is who we praise. This is an acknowledgment not only of the "otherness" of God but of our inability to effect worship of Him. Only by the grace and mercy of God can we have the privilege of offering up worship to Him. We praise the One who is beyond our ability to honor and we sing songs that can never repay Him for the love He holds for us. He is beyond all our inability to praise Him, but He is far beyond the subjects of our praise as well. No matter what you may come up with to praise Him for, I assure you, He has done far more than we even realize and is far beyond any of the praises we may lift to Him

for we can only wonder at every gift You send, at blessings without number and mercies without end; we lift our hearts before You and wait upon Your word we honor and adore You, our great and mighty Lord.

Every day grace, mercy, and blessings are poured out upon us that we never even notice. All we can do is lift our hearts to this great and mighty God and serve Him through the instructions of His Word to us. The God of innumerable blessings and mercies is the one we honor and adore with our song of praise and worship.

Then hear, O gracious Savior, accept the love we bring, that we who know Your favor may serve You as our King;

There is only one plea made in the two stanzas of this hymn. Here the worshiper begs God who is so beyond our comprehension and beyond our ability to worship to please listen and hear. Let those of us who have been granted your favor and your indulgences serve You as our King.

and whether our tomorrows be filled with good or ill, we'll triumph through our sorrows and rise to bless You still;

to marvel at Your beauty and glory in Your ways, and make a joyful duty our sacrifice of praise.

The hymn ends with a commitment. Reminiscent of the experiences and dedication of Job a high goal is set. No matter what happens in the near or distant future, the worshiper will lift praises to the God of heaven. The author recognizes in conclusion that our worship, no matter how seemingly ineffectual is a marvelous duty placed upon us by the God who has used wondrous and mysterious ways to bestow life upon us. To the God beyond all praising, we lift our sacrifice of praise.

## FAITH PROMISE UPDATE

In our last update, we reported that our Faith Promise pledge total was approximately \$10,000 less than the total budget from last year. We are thankful and grateful to report that the difference is now down to about \$2000.

There the church committee shared the gospel with her and her husband Pablo. Upon invitation, she readily gave her life to Jesus. Praise God! So excited for this. She is now attending church. Rafael and Sagri visit her once a week to give her new believer's class. Please pray for her husband Pablo to also come to know Christ.
- Jiannie and Jennie are daughters of John and Ruth Sierra. They are covenant children and have now expressed the desire to make profession of faith. We thank God for this family. ## Ministry to the Military, International

Dear Saints,

Let me give you an update on MM&I. Let me begin by sharing a verse that God used to greatly encourage me this week. It is Galatians 6:9 And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.

On May 13 MM&I hosted our first banquet and it was held at Eastwood Presbyterian Church, Montgomery, Alabama. It was quite an event. We had around 150 adults in attendance. The food was delicious! The Fellowship Hall was beautifully decorated! The volunteers gave us a beautiful setting for what was a wonderful evening of hearing what the Lord has done, is doing, and will do to advance His Kingdom!!

• Chester Replogle began the program sharing how the first PCA church was planted near a US military base overseas. It started with a Bible study in the Replogle's home in Germany. It grew to a core group and eventfully became a church plant of Southeast Alabama Presbytery.

•Michael Wutzke, Director of Music for Young Meadows Presbyterian, accompanied by Bonnie, his wife, provided a musical offering. He sang *A Prayer for Heroes* and *I Then Shall Live*. The lyrics are beautiful. The last stanza of *I Then Shall Live* really captured the essence of this ministry.

Your Kingdom come around and through and in me; Your power and glory, let them shine through me. Your Hallowed Name, O may I bear with honor, And may Your living Kingdom come in me. The Bread of Life, O may I share with honor, And may You feed a hungry world through me. Amen!

- Dr. Del Tackett was our Guest Speaker. Dr. Tackett is perhaps best known for his Christian World view Series. "The Truth Project." He was also one of the founders of New Geneva Theological Seminary, Executive Vice-President of Focus on the Family, served in the U.S. Air Force for over 20 years as a pilot, and also served at the White House under President George H.W. Bush. There is much more that could be said about Dr. Tackett but the one thing that stands out to me is his desire to help Christians think and act from a thoroughly biblical perspective. He spoke about our changing culture. And rather than acquiesce to those changes we need to hold firm in our Christian faith. He said that, with all the changes going on in the military currently, it is more important than ever to present a solid, biblical witness to the military community. He indicated very strongly that the ministry of MM&I was absolutely essential and worthy of the support of the people of God!
- Michael Viera, the most recent addition to our church planting team, gave those in attendance an overview of the work he and his family would be involved with in East Asia. MM&I is very excited about what we hope will be the first of many English speaking Presbyterian and Reformed churches planted in locations around the world; heretofore, left void of such a witness. Our target groups are expatriates and the 1-1.5 billion people who write and speak English as a second language. Michael and Andrea are "can do" people. Both graduated from West Point. Michael recently retired from the Vermont National Guard. He was also an Airborne Ranger and served several combat tours. He has served in both Iraq and Afghanistan. He has been on point for our nation and now he and his family are on point with MM&I to plant churches. Michael is also a graduate of Reformed Theological Seminary in Jackson, MS.

### We had three objectives for this banquet.

They were to ask for prayers for this ministry, to let the church know that we need men willing to go where there is a need, and lastly for the resources to send them.

MM&I does not have a staff. We use a number of volunteers. We have a few administrative expenses. I tell you this because almost every dollar given goes to hands-on-ministry. We are not trying to build a bloated organization. We are plowing our efforts into reaching people with the good news of Christ and helping them mature in the faith. I did have a very pleasant surprise a month or so ago. I received a call from a Christian foundation. The representative informed me that an individual has designated a gift for MM&I. Needless to say, I was overjoyed and I informed the Commission of Ministry to the Military & International. We agreed to divide the gift with those inistries/ministers of MM&I who were in the greatest need. I had the privilege of sharing this news with these men.

They joined me in thanking God for such a gift and thanking this man for using his God-given gift of liberality. What an affirmation that MM&I is on the right track. When God's people invest in His cause, and do so joyfully and liberally, it has quite an impact on so many people. O dear people, the Lord is changing lives and bringing forth a rich harvest of souls through the ministry.

We are now preparing for the PCA's General Assembly scheduled for June 20-24 in Mobile, Alabama. We will host a booth where we will be able to share about what the Lord is doing through this ministry. We will tell MM&I's story at GA, seek prayer support for the ministry, recruit for the ministry, and share our need for partners who will join with us in this worldwide outreach. ### **ABC MALAWI COMMENCEMENT**

On June 4, 2016, African Bible College in Malawi had its 22nd commencement exercise. Sixteen graduated with the Bachelor of Arts in Biblical Studies degree. Eighteen graduated with the Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communication degree. Twenty-eight graduated with the Bachelor of Arts in Christian Education degree. Nine graduated with the Master of Arts in Christian Leadership degree.



We're now seeing graduates in all segments of Malawian society. We have a couple in Parliament. Others are serving as headmasters, teachers, pastors, and broadcasters. I've now been here twenty-three years. I have seen a whole middle class develop in this country that didn't exist when I first got here. I've seen how education is the key to a nation's development, and so I stay. I also stay because I just plain enjoy teaching. It's like any job in that some days are more challenging than others, but it's been supremely satisfying.

The country of Malawi is undergoing significant challenge. Two consecutive years of erratic rainfall have created a worrying food crisis. There is unrest in neighboring Mozambique. The currency, known as the kwacha, is in freefall, creating damaging inflation. Still, there is no sense of panic here; Malawians have a way of just getting on with life.

You may have heard about Islamic terrorism in the world. Here, the population is about 16% Muslim; they make up most of the shop-owning business class. Christians and Muslims get along just fine in Malawi. I've been wished a Merry Christmas by Muslims. The country even had a Muslim president for ten years (1994 -2004), and it was during that time that African Bible College grew and even added a Christian radio station.

We now have a TV ministry. I have always wanted to be a TV preacher with my own jet. The jet may have to wait. however.

My thirteen-year-old son, Carey, has just finished the seventh grade. Just like me when I was his age, he struggles with math. There's a reason why I became a history teacher instead of a math teacher. History people and math people have brains that are wired differently. History people can't deal with (x+y)=n, and math people can't remember who the first president of the U.S. was.

Carey has been on the school swim team, the Stingrays, since the beginning of the first grade. He now has sixty-seven swim medals from three countries: Malawi, Zambia, and the United States.



Carey and I are coming back to the United States to begin another one-year home assignment (furlough). I use the term "home assignment" now instead of furlough because when I say "furlough" it makes you think I'm swinging in a hammock, sipping sweet tea. In fact we'll be traveling quite a bit, visiting churches and telling the story of African Bible College, and my ministry here. We'll be based in Memphis, and we arrive on August 1.


