On May 10th, Happy Hearts met in the fellowship hall for one of our favorite activities! An ole fashioned hymn sing! Rhonda White played the piano, Pat Wallace led the singing, and everyone selected their favorite hymns to sing. Then we sang to our hearts content! We don't get to sing these songs often in our worship services, so it was a special treat for our senior citizens. As our minister said recently in a sermon, we must all learn to be more tolerant of each other's preference when it comes to the songs we sing during our worship services. But at Happy Hearts, we were all of one accord because we all grew up singing these hymns. Some of the familiar hymns selected to sing included I Love to Tell the Story, What a Friend We have in Jesus, Blessed Assurance, Like a River Glorious, For the Beauty of the Earth, Take My Life and Let It Be, Blest Be the Tie That Binds, Amazing Grace, Onward Christian Soldiers (a song four of us recall singing as we marched behind the Christian flag into our sanctuary on every fifth Sunday throughout our childhood), A Mighty Fortress Is Our God, Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus, Showers of Blessings, Now I Belong to Jesus, My Tribute, How Sweet and Awesome is this Place, Be Thou My Vision, Leaning on The Everlasting Arms, and Jesus Loves Me to name a few.

HEARTS

All hymns are based on a verse of scripture, for instance I Love To Tell The Story is based on Psalm 66:16 "I will declare what he has done for my soul". Interestingly enough, Todd spoke to this subject last Sunday morning! Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus is based on Galatians 2:20 and the chorus is "Jesus, Jesus, how I trust him! How I've proved him o'er and o'er! Jesus, Jesus, precious Jesus! O for grace to trust him more!" Hopefully this is our

heartfelt sentiment. Leaning on the Everlasting Arms is composed from Deuteronomy 33:27, a verse I happened to notice recently in church as we read verses teaching the Law. The third verse, "What have I to dread, what have I to fear.....I have blessed peace with my Lord so near, Leaning on the everlasting arms." The "Trinity Hymnal" doesn't even list the title of the hymn, it lists only the appropriate Bible verse from which the hymn was written. It categorizes hymns by topic. For instance, "Jesus Loves Me" is listed under Children's Hymns. There are four verses to this song and unfortunately most of us only know one. The second verse is "Jesus loves me, he who died, heaven's gates to open wide; he will wash away my sin, let this little child come in." The third verse "Jesus loves me, loves me still, though I'm very weak and ill; from his shining throne on high comes to watch me where I lie." And finally, the fourth verse, "Jesus loves me, he will stay, close beside me all the way: if I love him, when I die he will take me home on high." It really isn't the melody, the beat, or even the instruments that define the song or determine its worth. Our wise and compassionate minister stated, it is the words that count most! I like that hymn books state the appropriate verse with each hymn.

I have attended this church for almost 70 years and we have been through several different hymn books in our sanctuary. The ones I recall are "The Presbyterian Hymnal", "Trinity Hymnal", "The Psalter", and the red hymnal we presently use, which is a revised edition of the "Trinity Hymnal". Poogie has been here ten years longer and probably can remember others. All this said to indicate that what we sing in church does change. Some of the songs we sang from our red hymnal were not included in the "Trinity Hymnal". It is interesting, isn't it? At any rate, we had a great time singing the songs we love! Thanks so much to Rhonda and Pat who were willing at the last minute to provide a wonderful program! Our

previously planned program didn't materialize, but it couldn't have been any better than this one.

Our meal was somewhat of a surprise - I had never eaten this casserole, but it had been recommended by Julie and our grandson, Whit. I knew they both knew a good meal when they ate it, so I ventured into serving a new recipe. It was a Tamale Casserole. Nell Fleming brought a delicious tossed salad, Anne Barkley and Frances Laws brought lemon desserts. Both were awesome! 

Jackson was a newborn baby when Jim and Susan accepted the call to be our minister. We watched him grow up, a beautiful little full faced boy with a very kind disposition, curls on top , bare knees in his seer sucker suit. He learned the Catechsim and most everything else. Both Jackson and his sister, Jillian, were exceptionally gifted intellectually. Their mother homeschooled them and must have done an amazing job! I'm told it is very rare for a child who has been homeschooled from kindergarten through 12th grade to be accepted into our military academies. Jackson's SAT scores were extremely high, which made a huge difference. He had some difficulty meeting the sports team requirement, since school teams had not been available to him in Valdosta, GA. 
