There are two other expressions I hear as I think of my friend and recall his nod and guick wink. Poogie always replied to the usual question of "How are you?" with the strong and true words "Better than I deserve."

How true and how few of us so readily admit our sinful condition and God's amazing goodness to us. Another of his frequently shared remarks was "It doesn't get any better than that!" What a positive way of thinking - to be happy, satisfied, and contented with his life and the daily events he experienced. Again like Dr. Villee, Poogie loved to fish and was the most devout fisherman I ever In his latter years he enjoyed giving knew. fishhook lapel pins to every man he met. It became a ministry to him and provided him an opportunity to witness. Poogie was truly one of the most unique and consistent people I have known. He was guick witted, generous, frugal with our church's money, loyal, true to his genetic background, somewhat of a hoarder, kind, caring, yet a sinner, always striving to honor our Lord, and forever a friend. Poogie was a faithful servant of the Lord and he enjoyed Happy Hearts as much as anyone could. We will all miss him, but we rejoice in his being present with the Lord.


