
The Main Thing

As a church we pledge to support missionaries prayerfully and financially. All monetary support for our Missions Partners comes **only** through our Faith Promise pledges and designated missions giving. It is separate and above the tithe.


The total of the Faith Promise Pledges received last Spring for 2021 was \$34,550. Since February and through the month of October, we have received donations totaling \$19,388.22. This is approximately 56% of expected pledge receipts.

We have between now and the end of January 2022 to meet our pledges for the current budgeted year. We send the final support payments in January for our Oct. – Dec. fiscal quarter. February 2022 will mark the beginning of the new pledge year.

There are always ongoing needs and new opportunities for our missions partners to put our gifts to use for His Kingdom work.
