"I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. Every time you interact with a child here in this church, you are fulfilling God's calling in assisting those families in the raising of their young man or young woman. I know that in my personal life, I certainly credit my faith to the faith of my parents and grandparents as well as my church family growing up. The Lord certainly used them in my life to convict me of my sin and drive home my need for a Savior.

MSPC, Casting the Net

In the New Testament, the fisherman is a visual motif used by Christ to illustrate the work of evangelism. Some of the men he chose as his apostles were fishermen, and he challenged them ultimately to be fishers of men. The primary tool of the fisherman in that day was not the rod and reel but the net. Appropriately, today, we are discussing a different net. Yet, it is still a tool in our quest to be fishers of men. I want to review MSPC's online presence on the net with you. For many of you, this should be redundant information with which you are already familiar. For others, it may be the first time you have heard of how connected we are.



Let's begin with REALM CONNECT. REALM is church administration software that manages our church's financial, membership, and calendaring information, including your giving, contact, and family information. Every family in the church should have at least one individual with a log-in that allows you to update your REALM profile and keep your contact information current. REALM CONNECT is a free phone app you can download at your app store that will enable you to view and communicate with members through our online church directory. REALM can be customized so

that calendaring and event information can be shared with individuals or with defined groups. Groups like Happy Hearts, Deacons, or Sunday School Teachers can have unique alerts and chat within their group alone or with the entire church body. The upside of REALM is that it is private, limited to our church family, and safe from outside influence. The downside of REALM has been that while it is extremely powerful and very private, it is not as user-friendly as many other social media platforms you may already be familiar with. If you need a REALM log-in or help setting up a group, contact me at *ronsimpson64@gmail.com*, and I will gladly help you.

Next, we have our church website, which is located at <u>https://www.mainstreetpres.org</u>. The page was designed with the hope that individuals seeking a church in the area would be drawn to who we are. We strive for the page to be an accurate reflection of the church. One can learn

about the church's history, location, parking availability, leadership, events, sermon library, and access to live streaming links. The page also serves as a hub from which the other online platforms discussed in this article can be accessed. Linking icons for every



icle can be accessed. Linking icons for every social platform discussed here can be found at the top and bottom of every page on the website. We also post the weekly bulletin and monthly newsletter in case you missed yours in the

email You can even give online at the website by accessing the REALM giving portal. If you have never visited our website, I encourage you to check it out and see what is available there.

Our Facebook page, located at <u>https://www.facebook.com/mainstreetpresbyterianchurch</u>, is an online bulletin board for our church. While we try to use REALM for our primary church-wide alerts and communication, we often double the information with a Facebook post. This is only when sharing information suitable for anyone outside the church like a promotion. However, when sharing a prayer need, a family crisis, or other more confidential communications, we stick to REALM for privacy's sake. We post the unique streaming link for Sunday Morning Worship each week.



We often encourage members to share Facebook posts with friends to expand our online presence. If you are more into Instagram, you can find us by searching for MainStreetPres. Follow us, and you will get our Facebook posts, which are duplicated there.

One of our most unique and potent online presences is our YouTube channel. To find us there, go to YouTube and search for Main Street Church Media or enter "@mainstreetpresbyterianchur2577" in the search window. At the time of this article, our YouTube channel has over




400 videos posted and 171 subscribers. Some videos posted there have had hundreds of views. Our morning worship services are streamed on YouTube and shared weekly through Facebook/Instagram posts. Home-bound individuals, families on vacation, and "the curious"



checking us out have a weekly opportunity to enjoy our worship services. Several families have been drawn to our fellowship by finding us and experiencing our worship services online before moving here. Special events, weddings, and memorial services on request are also shared here. There have even been situations in which family members halfway around the world found comfort in participating in a loved one's memorial service through this ministry.

We have a presence on X (formerly Twitter), although it is not used nearly as much as our other platforms. You can locate our presence on X by searching for @MainStreetPres. It is used primarily to promote the morning worship links and post audio sermon files, which brings us to our last platform, SermonAudio.

SermonAudio is an online library of millions of sermon audio files posted by preachers and ministries worldwide. I mentioned earlier that we have a sermon library posted on our church website. Well, the truth is, we have two libraries posted there. As noted, our worship service is streamed and shared each week on YouTube, where it remains and can be viewed anytime. Following each worship service, the audio of the sermon portion alone is taken from the video and posted



separately on our website and at SermonAudio. When you go to our website and hover over the Resources and Sermons tabs you can access either the MSPC Library or the SermonAudio Browser. At the MSPC Sermon Library you can view the entire worship service or just click on



the audio to hear the sermon alone. You may listen to or download any posted sermon you choose at either of these libraries. So, suppose you didn't get point number three of last week's sermon or

want to select a sermon to listen to during your morning commute. In that case, you have free access to hundreds of past and present sermons posted by our pastors (over 700 are available there), and through SermonAudio you have three million more messages from which to choose. Sermons at both sites are organized by date, speaker, series, and sermon text. What is even more exciting about SermonAudio is that our pastor's messages are being listened to by people worldwide. We even get a report of how many clicks a particular sermon gets from each country.

For a church, the internet and social media are never replacements for the benefits of participation in your local church. These platforms, however, are an extraordinary means to expand the impact of the work of our church body, reach out to the world, and maybe even bring others into our fellowship via the invisible net. So, next time you feel the urge to search for some cat memes to share or the need to post something for which you know you will get trolled, check out your church's presence on the internet. Share a post or link the Lord might use to touch or change the heart of someone you have never met or may never know. Ron Simpson

African Bible University Missionary needs:

1. Aviation Teachers Needed! African Bible University



has developed two new Aviation Degrees 1. BS Aviation Management, 2. BS Professional Pilot. But we cannot get approval from the government to begin because we need properly qualified teachers! We need teachers who have a PhD or a Masters in an Aviation related field, who are dedicated Bible Believing Christians who walk with the Lord. 1-2 years of experience is preferred, but the appropriate degree and Christian character are the most important. We would like to begin teaching Aviation courses this August, but time is running out to be prepared in time! We are targeting to launch the Aviation Management degree first, so if you are not a pilot that is not a barrier to serving.

2. Aviation department financial needs: We are in need of prayer and financial partners to help us keep our aircraft flying! We need to raise \$33,000/year to keep up with our goals. <u>https://www.africanbiblecolleges.com/abc-aviation</u>

Prayer Warrior Update #150 from African Bible Colleges

March Madness is always an exciting time, especially for those who like basketball. Jack did. In fact, he liked all sports- so much that when he drew up the plans for the first African Bible College in Liberia, he made sure that the gymnasium was the biggest and most expensive building on the campus. We had almost finished raising all the funds to underwrite the buildings for the first college. Our last church to visit was in Macon, Georgia, where the pastor, Jim Baird, had asked Jack to speak to the college class. As he talked about the college and "faith in action" he said, "now we only have two buildings left for churches to underwrite- one is a dormitory and one is the gymnasium, but the gym is not essential for us to start the college, but be praying about it." After that Macon Sunday school class, a tall, lanky young man came up and said, "I am at the University of Florida and I'm training to play basketball in the Olympics, and I think the gym is important." He opened his wallet and said, "I only have \$10, but I want to give it as a downpayment for that gymnasium, because you've been talking about faith in action."

So, we left that church and we only needed to raise the funds for the dorm and the gym. The church in Macon said they would be praying about it and they would let us know what they could do. As we drove into the driveway of our little missions house in Jackson, Mississippi, the phone was ringing inside. Jack jumped out of the car and ran in to answer the phone. It was Jack Ross, pastor of Brookhaven Presbyterian church. He said, "Hey Jack! We've just talked with the session and we've decided to take the last dormitory!" And he hung up the phone. A few days later, Jim Baird called and said, "We just voted to take the dormitory!" Jack replied, "Well, I have a story to tell you..." And he told him the story of the young man from the Sunday School class. Jim Baird said, "Okay! We will take the gym and we'll let the Sunday School class pick up the other \$5000."

I don't know who will be in the winners bracket for March Madness, but I do know there have been multitudes of students to watch and to play in the Macon gymnasium in Malawi, Liberia, and Uganda all because one young college student put his faith into action and used his last ten-dollar bill as a down payment on a gymnasium.


