Make Time for Fellowship

In Hebrews chapter 10 verses 24-25, the writer encourages us with these words "let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

This admonition about fellowship comes in the middle of a section that is focused on God as the source of our faith. The writer then encourages us to live holy lives in light of what we have been taught. It may seem out of place to have this encouragement to gather together, but if you think about it, this is precisely what we often need to remember our

faith and to remember what God has done in our lives and the lives of those around us. How does he do this? I want to point out three ways in which gathering together regularly as Christians grows our faith.

First, the author tells us that we are to "consider how to stir up one another to love and good works." I love that idea of stirring one another up. When we meet together and we spend time with one another, we challenge one another to love and to do good works. I know that when I am around others who are really serious about their walk with Christ, just spending time with them makes me want to take my faith more seriously. It makes me want to go and do likewise. May we provide for one another, that stirring stick that we will not become complacent.

Second, the author tells us to **"not neglect to meet together, as is the habit of some, but to encourage one another."** When we are together with fellow believers, we have the unique opportunity to encourage one another. We can offer a shoulder to cry on, we can let them know that it is going to be ok. We can remind them of what the Lord has done in a similar situation and point that person to Him. This is something each of us will need in different seasons in our lives, and who better than fellow believers to provide this loving support?

Third, as we gather together, we are to remember that "the Day of the Lord is drawing near." When we gather together as fellow believers, whether it is in worship or in fellowship, we are receiving a taste of what heaven will be like. We are getting a glimpse of eternity. I pray that being with the saints brings you joy and encouragement. Because this is what it will be like to be with the saints in glory, many times better. We remember that the Day of the Lord is drawing near, and we are strengthened to stand fast and hold on.

So what does this look like practically? I encourage you, as we go into the summer months, not to neglect to meet together as is the habit of some. Make every effort to attend corporate worship. Keep informed on the special activities that your church provides so that you can take every effort to encourage one another and be encouraged yourself. Or maybe start new fellowship activities if you feel there is a gap in our practices, so that you are contemplating the **Day of the Lord drawing near.** I am excited for this time of year, and I am excited to spend it with you all. May the Lord bless this season for our church body, and may we thank God for all of the opportunities we will have to gather together.





Just this week I attended the Presbytery meeting of Providence Presbytery in North Alabama. I was able to chat with some of the attendees who were familiar with our ministry. Some have prayerfully supported us, others have donated to us, others have even visited some of our churches. Without exception, these men expressed kind words concerning MMI.

Please continue to pray and consider giving. As stated recently, we have some serious security and safety matters at Trinity Reformed of Landstuhl Germany—they are in the process of purchasing upgraded shudders ("rolladen" in German) and looking at constructing an emergency exit out of the sanctuary; Grace Presbyterian of Pyeongtaek South Korea is moving into a rental space, but need around \$60,000 to pay the up-front expenses (including renovation, equipment, etc.) Some individuals and churches have already donated to both causes, but we need more funding for these projects.

In addition, New Life Vicenza Italy renovated a kitchen and made some other purchases recently. This church has been great for impacting new believers and even some local Italians. Continued outside giving is a must to sustain this small body of 55-60 people.

Paige Pilkinton will Return to Slovakia in July

Dear Main Street Presbyterian Church,

My name is Paige Pilkinton, daughter of Henry and Sandra Pilkinton, and a grateful product of the love and support poured out by this congregation. It's hard to believe, but this summer will mark my **sixth year leading** a short-term mission trip to Slovakia. I'm amazed that what began as a one-time opportunity has grown into an ongoing journey of watching God move powerfully in the lives of students—and transforming my own life in the process.

This year, we'll be heading to a **new location**: the town of **Ružomberok**, **Slovakia**, where we'll partner with a local evangelical church to run a Christian English camp for high school students. While the location has changed, the heart of the mission remains the same: to share the gospel with students, many of whom have never heard it before, and to help them connect with a local church community where they can grow in their faith throughout the year.

This spring, I accepted a new job at the **College of Charleston** as a **grants administrator**, and with limited time off, I initially believed I wouldn't be able to attend camp this year. But God, in His kindness, made a way— I've been **amazed** by how He provided the time off I needed to return to Slovakia once again.

Our theme for 2025 is "**Real Life.**" We'll explore what it means to live fully and authentically in light of the gospel—that in the middle of our mess and questions, Jesus meets us with grace, truth, and the promise of real, abundant life. So many students arrive at camp feeling lost, weighed down by brokenness, and searching for something real. We pray they leave knowing that real life is found in Christ alone.

The mission trip will take place **July 14–29**, and I would be deeply grateful for your prayers. **Please pray:**

- That students would come with open hearts and curiosity about Jesus
- That the gospel would be proclaimed clearly and lived out with love
- For strength, unity, and energy for both the American and Slovak leaders
- For safe travels for all team members
- That relationships built at camp would lead students into deeper connection with Christ and the local church

That Others May Know Him

Dear Friends and Ministry Partners,

In my last letter I told you about James, an inmate at the prison where I teach a Bible class. He had a sentence of Life Without Parole, but got out through the efforts of a local law firm. James and I are keeping in touch by phone once a week and lunch once a month. I give the 22 men in my class a report on James' progress each week. After 43 years in prison some of these men have become very close friends.

James is making good progress in the transition to the "free world." He is living with his brother in Birmingham, but wants to get a place of his own. He has applied for a room in an "old folk's home." He now has a small amount of Social Security income and medical coverage. He saw an oncologist two weeks ago who confirmed that he has cancer in the bones of his back. He got biopsy last week and will start radiation or chemo this week. He is trusting the Lord for the outcome.

We just finished the winter semester of evangelism training at my church. As you know, we go out every week to share the gospel at the UAB campus or in apartments. This semester we shared the gospel with 199 people with 27 making a profession of faith in Christ. My team shared 22 times with 1 profession. I missed 1 week due to a CRU Prison Ministry conference in Ohio, came home sick and then missed 2 more weeks. I was glad to get back to work.




