## Train Up a child

One of the great joys of my ministry career has been the just over 12 years that I have worked in and with youth ministry. This has taken many forms over those years as I have taught Jr. High and Sr. High youth group, led conferences, gone on mission trips, organized and participated in Summer Camp, and taught Bible at a private Christian School. I messaged one of my former students just this week on social media after I saw a picture of a Quokka, an animal that he and his classmates were convinced I resemble, and we had a laugh and updated each other on where our lives have taken us.

As a session, we have been prayerfully considering the next steps for our church. We are looking not just at the current year but 5 years and 10 years down the road. As we do this, one thing is clear: we are blessed at Main Street with an abundance of children. We love this, and I hope you as a church do as well. Jeph Guinan, a PCA pastor and the head of the church planting committee in Evangel Presbytery who is helping with the church plant, told me that the marks of a growing church are: 1. Conversions taking place, 2. Families joining the church, and 3. People are convicted and willing to financially support the ministry. We are not a church plant, but as a church, we are seeing an increase in each of these areas each year. Because of this, and with the effort of looking ahead, we have decided to establish a youth committee to prayerfully consider hiring an Assistant Pastor to develop and grow a youth program here at Main Street.

We have a real opportunity to develop a ministry that will prayerfully fill the gap between our children's ministry here at the church and our adult ministries. I truly do believe that there is a space for doctrinal, relational ministry at the youth level, which will benefit our students as they grow into godly young men and godly young women.

Part of why I am writing this letter is to let you know we hear you. I have had many people tell me they would love to see us bring on a youth pastor to care for our youth. The other reason I am writing this is to get your help. First and foremost, we want you to join us in prayer. Please pray for your committee and pray that the Lord will bring us the right candidate at the right time. We are looking for someone who will be ordainable or already ordained in our denomination, so that limits who we can select, but it also gives us opportunities in other areas. But we also know that you may have someone, a family member, a friend, a neighbor, who the Lord might be preparing for such a ministry as this. If that is the case, we would love for you to reach out to me and let me know. I'd be happy to talk with them and bring their information to the committee.

There are a lot of wonderful things going on at Main Street. It has been an absolute blessing over the last two years to be with you all. I cannot wait to see what the Lord is planning on doing through this church body. I am grateful to be able to serve you and your families. And I pray that as we continue to grow, we tirelessly look for ways in which we can glorify God and grow as a Christian family to a better degree. Don't hesitate to reach out to me if you have any questions. I am more than happy to talk youth ministry with any of you.



Dear Friends and Ministry Partners,

An unusual event happened with my prison Bible class this December. For a variety of reasons, I do not meet with my class from the first week in December until the first week in January. I do send the men a Christmas card. But a card I sent to one of the men named James came back with "DEATH" written on it. I learned that James had been diagnosed with cancer the first week in December, so I thought he had died. But when I come back in January, I learned that he did not die but was out and living with his brother in Birmingham. He had a cell phone so I called him and we ate lunch together the next day.

He got out due to the work of a law firm, Alabama Appleseed. They are targeting men who were given a sentence of life without parole under the three strikes and you are out law passed in 1980. Most of these men have never done anything violent, but have three felonies. Of the 26,000 incarcerated in Alabama 20% are under this law. They should have gone to prison, but not given life without. The law firm is helping James get the benefits he needs to live in the "free world."

I have known James for over 30 years and he was the first man I trained in evangelism when I started ministering at the prison. When we had lunch, he told me he is 77 years old and was in prison for 43 years. Also, he told me he is trying to witness to a friend who is a Muslim but only wants to argue. So, when he got out the first thing he did is try to witness to his friends! We agreed to stay in touch by phone each week and have lunch once a month when we can. He has almost nothing and I took him some of my clothes as we are about the same size. It will be interesting to see how the Lord provides for him now. Included is a biographical sketch from the Appleseed website.

#### JAMES OLIVER JONES | AGE 73

HAS SERVED 38 YEARS WITH TWO
DISCIPLINARY INFRACTIONS, INCLUDING ONE
FOR HAVING AN UNAUTHORIZED COOKIE.

Mr. Jones persevered seven years in order to earn an associates degree while incarcerated, then went on to tutor others in Adult Basic Education classes. The ADOC no longer permits people serving life imprisonment without parole to enroll in college classes. Mr. Jones has tried to continue his education with religious classes taught by volunteers.

"I have scores of certificates from Bible courses, dating back 20 years. Yes, I am one of the oldest members of the faith-based honor dorm. I've been in the [honor dorm] approximately 20 years."

My most recent experiences here in prison are quite different from when I first came to prison. The respect factor is now nearly non-existent. Maybe we have too many young guys here now. The cellphones and dope have changed prison forever. And to be honest, the current administration just don't know how to deal with this obvious problem."

"To give a person life without when he took no life is draconian.... We have just too many bodies in prison."


