What is significant about infant baptism?

On Easter Sunday, I had the privilege of baptizing Meredith Grace Fisackerly. Our book of church order requires a lesson related to baptism to be given before each one is performed. I wanted to share with you all what I recited during the service. This is a modified outline from my Senior Pastor in Overland Park, Kansas. Tony taught me a love for administering the sacrament of baptism rooted in a deep love for the covenant family. I pray that you find these words an encouragement.

The Christian faith is a covenantal faith.

A covenant is a commitment that is marked with outward expressions or signs.

When we speak of God being a covenantal God or a covenant-keeping God, we are referring to the way He has made a commitment from of old to save a people for Himself.

He made this commitment known in time and space when our first parents fell into sin in the Garden. As our representatives, all mankind plunged into sin with them.

Separated from God by sin and doomed for a just punishment, the only way we could be forgiven for our sin and have fellowship with God as our Father would be for a Second Adam to come and undo what he first Adam did.

Like the first Adam represented us, so also, for all those whom the Father gave to the Second Adam, he represented us on the Cross and cleansed us from all our sins. Jesus was the perfect Second Adam, our Savior.

In the Old Testament, the people of God or the Church were called Israel. They looked forward to the coming of Christ and their redemption through Him. God gave them a sign to express His covenant promise to them. It would serve to remind them of what He would do on their behalf. The sign in the Old Testament was circumcision.

The sign was to be applied to those who believed and their male children. The sign marked the Israelites as distinct from the rest of the world. Furthermore, it symbolized God's hand of favor upon them.

After Jesus came and fulfilled God's covenant with his blood on the cross, the people of God were not limited to one nation any longer.

Jesus opened the way to the Gentiles as was forecasted under Abraham centuries before. It was always the intention of God's covenant for Christ to be the Savior of all tribes and nations.

The sign of the covenant is no longer a bloody rite limited to males. It is now the sign of water baptism applied to men and women who believe, and their children. It pictures the way God cleanses our sin by the work of Christ.

The transference from a limited covenant sign of circumcision happened on the day of Pentecost when Peter was preaching to a group made up mostly of Jewish believers.

Acts 2:35-38 [36] Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." [37] Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" [38] And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. [39] For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself."

Did you hear Peter's covenantal promise language? Do you see who it was aimed at?

...For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself.

So we apply the covenant sign of baptism to those who believe in Christ, and their children, with a firm belief in the promises of God to give our children repentance and faith in due time, whenever He wills.

By applying the sign of baptism to this child, we are saying that we believe in God's promises and we trust in His sovereign hand. We are declaring that the only way of salvation is by faith in the finished work of Christ for the washing away of our sins by His blood.

It's not baptism that saves, but rather it is what baptism represents that saves- the blood of Jesus Christ shed on our behalf and applied by faith.

Baptism is not about our commitment to God, but rather it is about God's covenantal commitment to His people.

May we all use this as an opportunity to reflect upon our own baptisms and praise God for His covenant faithfulness to His people.

Dear Friends,

I hope you are well and encouraged. With Easter weekend upon us we have so much to be thankful for. What a joy to mark and celebrate the death and resurrection of our Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. I will be praying for you all, and especially that the resurrection power of our risen Saviour will be evident in your churches and lives.

The last few months have been especially busy for me with two trips to the USA. It was great to reconnect with old friends and to make news ones in Charlotte, Greenville, Asheville, Nashville, Huntsville, and Chattanooga. A special welcome to those who are receiving an email for the first time.

Without further ado I have fantastic news to share with you, as well as to ask for ongoing prayer, and to give you an update on what God is doing in Oxford Pres.

Amazing News! Most of you will know that in 2023, and after 3 years of rollercoaster negotiations, God opened the door for us to take a 35-year lease on the North Gate Hall from Oxford City Council. That lease was an amazing answer to prayer and a really good arrangement. It gave us security of tenure and the opportunity to make significant alterations to the building. The downside was it tied us and our successors to very significant rent payments every year.



Our dream and prayer was always that, at some point, we would have the opportunity to upgrade the tenancy to actual ownership. I am thrilled to tell you that, just a few weeks ago, we completed the process of buying the North Gate Hall! With incredibly generous help from external supporters we were able to buy the freehold for the North Gate Hall from the Council outright with no debt.

This is a mind-boggling development and once again we have seen our great God work in unusual and unexpected ways. Church buildings that have been converted to restaurants in England don't

come back to be churches again. But this one has! Tiny evangelical church plants with tiny resources don't get buildings, in this city in particular. But God has done it! Not only did the City Council vote unanimously to sell the building to us, but the process of agreeing and exchanging the legal contracts went smoothly.

Please join us in giving thanks to God for this remarkable provision.

Pray on!

As fantastic as this news is, we still need your prayers and support. The Lord has wonderfully blessed our capital fund raising, yet we have pressing needs for our day-to-day operational costs and further fundraising to do for the renovation of the North Gate Hall.

Please pray for internal giving to grow in the coming year. As we grow numerically as a church (see below), please pray for support to grow from within as well.

Please also pray for new partners and supporting churches. One of my recent trips to the USA was almost entirely focused on that need. I had several very encouraging meetings and we now look to the Lord to provide.

Church life and evangelism continues ...

Whilst so much has happened behind the scenes with the North Gate Hall, we have continued to worship and



witness as a church. This centres on our two Sunday services. We have seen lots of new people visit us, worship with us, and join us, since Christmas. So much so that space in our building has on occasion been a rare commodity. We have welcomed new members and are looking forward to two baptisms in the next few weeks. This all highlights the pressing need for us to get on with the building renovations so we can increase the seating in the North Gate Hall and so accommodate our growing numbers.

Do pray for the Lord to continue to add to us and to especially work in the many non-Christians who attend our services.

Student work doubles ...(!)

Over the last few months we have seen our student work double in size. Demand was so strong for 'Rooted' - our bi-weekly evening of pizza and Bible study - we have now increased it to a weekly meeting. It has been such a delight to see 30+ students gather on Tuesday evenings to dig deep into God's Word. We have seen even more attend our services, often inviting their friends and bringing non-Christians with them.

Please pray for us as we endeavour to shepherd and care for these students. Many are young in the faith and eager to learn, which is both a privilege and a responsibility!

Thank you so much for your prayers and support for Oxford Pres. There is much more to report but that will have to wait until another update soon. Since the inception of Oxford Pres in September 2018 it has been clear the Lord has answered your prayers in surprising ways. Your interest in and support for all that is happening in Oxford Pres continues to encourage and humble me.

On a personal note, we are busy as a family preparing for Alicia's wedding in late June. We praise God for her fiance, Jonah, who is a godly young man. Whilst I can't promise I won't cry as I walk her down the aisle, I will nonetheless be filled with thankfulness and joy.






VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR DIAPER CHANGING STATION

We are wishing everyone a happy and fun summer!


