When you go to a store help return shopping carts that are left scattered around.

Donate old blankets and towels to an animal shelter.

Invite some to play and do what they want to do.

Go to a neighborhood event/council meeting.

Help a classmate with their homework.

Buy mom or dad or your caregiver their favorite candy or treat.

Hug a sibling.

Pray for one of our missionaries (see Church Center Local & Global Partners Group)
