

REZ CAMP

GRADES
2nd-9th

Rez (overnight) camp provides an opportunity for both spiritual and personal growth in a dynamic environment completely removed from the hectic pace of everyday life. Whether conquering teambuilding challenges at the Adventure Zone, enjoying conversation and songs shared around the campfire, or playing legendary games, these overnight campers receive a rich experience through a fun and caring setting that they will remember for years to come.

To foster the spirit of building new friendships, groups larger than 4 will not be assigned to the same overnight cabin. No exceptions. All requested names must be listed on both registrations. If you list a friend request on your registration and you are not listed on their registration, the request will not be honored.

*Each session campers will have their respective grade range in their cabins. No overlap in ages, no exceptions.

*If a camper leaves for any reason during the week, they will not be able to return.

*Campers can be registered for multiple sessions with the understanding that programming is very similar from week to week.

OVERNIGHT ENCOUNTER CAMP

GRADES
6th-9th

DETAILS

This new program will foster a spirit of discovery for your camper. With two different camp focuses, Art and Extreme, your camper will have an intensive camp experience during this three day overnight camp while also growing in their faith. Campers will experience Chapel times, daily free time, as well as dedicated time to focus on developing their skills in their chosen program. Counselors with expertise in these areas will aid your camper in developing their confidence, building relationships, and finding new love for their Creator.

EXTREME

Discover new skills and techniques around camp in climbing, archery, and team building activities. The 3-day experience will close with a climbing event in which families and campers are invited to participate. The campers will participate in a GelBall experience as part of their programming.



ART

Learn the process of creative expression in the visual arts while working with 3 different media: paint, pencil, and clay. Campers will be encouraged to share and express their ideas as well as participate in team building exercises. At the end of the 3-day experience, campers will host an art show for families to attend.

SAMS OVERNIGHT

GRADES 10th-13th

The Servants At Manitouqua program seeks to challenge students entering 10th - 13th grade to live in service to Christ and others. During this week long overnight camp experience, SAMs will have the opportunity to enjoy fellowship with other high schoolers, learn about God's Word, and be challenged to live out their faith. SAMs will participate in classic camp activities, serve other staff and campers by cleaning, assisting with program needs, and running the Pickle Shack. SAMs service and leadership are important to the ministry at Manitouqua. This program is geared to help participants grow closer to God through individual study and conversations. Participants will be active in small group discussions, teambuilding, personal assessment, leadership opportunities, service opportunities, and will study Scripture together. The SAMs program requires campers to apply:

- 1) Complete your online registration in CampBrain for your camper.
- 2) Select your desired program and have the camper complete the application questions.
- 3) SAMs applicants will be placed on the waitlist until the application process is completed. No spot will be held until the SAMs application is completed by the camper. On April 1st and May 1st, completed applications will be reviewed and applications will be notified if accepted. This is not a first come, first serve program.

If a SAM leaves early or misses any program time, they will not receive service hours.

REGISTRATION

To register, complete the online process at Manitoqua.org

- Online registration is preferred, though completed registration forms will be accepted by mail, fax, or drop off.
- Minimum payments must be provided in order to complete registration. There are no exceptions to this policy.
- Registration confirmation and vital information is sent via email. A valid email address is required for registration.
- Registrations are processed on a first-come, first-served basis and are open to everyone, regardless of race or national origin.
- Program weeks can be added after initial registration.
- Grade level refers to the Fall 2026 school year.
- Registrations are non-transferable.
- No registrations will be taken over the phone.

CAMPER CONDUCT

NO abusive language or fighting is allowed. Smoking, alcohol, and drug use of any type will not be tolerated. All scheduled events must be attended. Other campers and counselors must be respected. Violators will be sent home at the parent's expense and may not be eligible to return the following summer.

- To prevent loss of items, please label camper's belongings. Manitoqua is not responsible for the theft or damage of personal property or items left behind.
- For swim time, girls need to wear one-piece swim suits, and boys wear regular swim trunks (no speedos).
- No electronic or cellular devices are allowed at camp including cell phones, smart watches, tablets, or computers.
- A program letter will be emailed prior to the week of camp with more information.

PROGRAM SCHEDULES

Camp schedules will be emailed to camper families along with cabin and day camp group assignments on the Friday before the scheduled week.

All activities are subject to counselor schedules and weather. No activities are guaranteed.

Any medical attention needed for a camper during a camp session is the responsibility of the parent/guardian.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Participants who wish to change or cancel **must call the office 815.469.2319 no later than 10 days prior to the start of the relevant program in order to receive any refund, less the fees listed below.** A full refund can be given for documented medical emergency as long as it is before camp starts. Campers who leave for any reason during their camp session will not receive a refund.

- Changes are subject to availability.
- Changes are subject to a \$20 fee.
- Cancellations are subject to a \$40 fee.
- Programs are subject to cancellation by Camp Manitoqua. Participants will be notified 10 days prior to the event and given a full refund if the program is cancelled.
- Cancel any session before May 1, 2026 and pay only the change fee of \$20 per session per camper.

PAYMENT INFO

Pay in full for all weeks of Day Camp or make a **minimum required payment of at least \$175** on each of the desired weeks. All remaining day camp balances **are due by June 1st**. Rez Camp and SAMs overnight camp require payment in full at the time of registration. Payment reminders will be emailed. Spots will not be held if minimum payment is not made. Any unpaid balances will forfeit your spot.

Frequently Asked Questions

Are there scholarships available for camp?

Each year, some funding is allocated to assist families financially in sending their camper to camp. To apply for a scholarship, contact hunter@manitoqua.org. Scholarship funding is not guaranteed and each application is reviewed on a case by case basis.

Does Camp Manitoqua provide lunch?

Camp Manitoqua asks parents to pack a lunch for their day camper. The packed lunch will be stored in a refrigerator until lunch time. For overnight campers, all meals are prepared throughout the week by our kitchen staff.

What happens on a rainy day?

During rainy days, staff will have indoor activities prepared. Each program has a specific indoor area for this time. If lightning is within 10 miles of camp, campers will be brought inside and will stay inside until lightning has been clear within 10 miles of camp for 30 minutes.

Can I pack snacks and drinks for my REZ camper?

You can pack snacks and drinks for your camper, however, it needs to be able to seal to keep pests away! We discourage coolers as campers have limited space in the cabin to store such items. Keep in mind that Camp Manitoqua provides everything they will need for the week!

Can my child bring technology to camp?

Electronic devices (CELL PHONES, SMART WATCHES OF ANY KIND, COMPUTERS, & IPADS) **ARE NOT ALLOWED**. If a camper is found with an electronic device or smart watch (of any kind) it will be taken and stored in the office for parent pick up at the end of the day.
