We also find that there is joy in the promise. The joy of Advent is not superficial or fleeting; it is rooted in the unshakable promise of Emmanuel—God with us. This joy goes beyond the twinkling lights and cheerful celebrations. It is the deep, abiding joy of knowing that we are loved, cherished, and never alone. As we light the Advent candles, may our hearts be kindled with the joy that comes from living in the light of God's promises.

Finally, we find that love is in the giving. Love is the heart of the Advent season. It is the love that moved God to send His Son into the world to save us. It is the love that calls us to serve one another, to extend grace, and to share the good news of Christ's birth. Advent challenges us to let love be our guide, shaping our words, actions, and attitudes as we prepare to celebrate the greatest gift ever given.

This Advent season, I invite you to walk through these themes of hope, peace, joy, and love. Take time each week to reflect, to pray, and to be present with God and with those around you. Let this be a time of renewal and preparation, as we ready our hearts to see Christ anew.

May this Advent be a season of deep spiritual blessing for you and your loved ones, as we anticipate the wonder of Christmas together.

## **Maples Youth**


