ELEVATE Retreat 2024

All youth (6th-12th grades) are invited to attend Elevate retreat January 12-15, 2024 in Gatlinburg, TN. Elevate is a Student Ministry Conference that started in 2011 in Gatlinburg. It is a high-energy, relationally-structured weekend that includes speaker, worship, small-group time, and plenty of fun stuff to do. Each youth can choose their free time activity which will determine the cost of the trip. The ski option will cost \$295, snowboard option is \$325, and the non-ski option is \$235. The cost included travel, all conference sessions, 3 nights lodging, 3 breakfasts, 2 days of skiing or snowboarding (depending on the selected package) with lesson and equipment, and tram tickets. Tram tickets are included for non-skiers as well. A deposit of \$115 will reserve your spot and is due no later than Wednesday, November 29th. The

second payment will be due January 4, 2024. Please note that payments are non-refundable.
