



## Discussion Guide:

### He Will Bring Peace

**Passage:** Isaiah 11:1-10

**Summary:** This week, we looked at Isaiah 11 and the promise of a coming King—Jesus—who brings the kind of peace the world cannot create on its own. We saw that His peace begins with restoring our relationship with God, continues as He gives us His presence and calm in the middle of life's uncertainty, and will one day renew all creation so that everything broken is made whole again. Because of that hope, we are invited not only to receive His peace but to live it out—seeking justice, extending grace, and pointing others to the Prince of Peace. True peace isn't just a feeling or a wish—it's found in the person and reign of Jesus Christ.

## Discussion Questions

1. What was the main point of this passage?
2. What is the Spirit drawing your attention to in the passage?
3. How would you describe Biblical Peace, Shalom? How is that different from the worldly definition of peace?
4. What does the 'stump of Jesse' symbolize in v. 1, and how can this symbolism provide hope during difficult times?
5. How does the description of the Messiah in Isaiah 11:2-5 relate to Jesus?
6. How might the promise of restoration in Isaiah 11:10-16 offer hope in today's world?
7. What are the spaces in your life where you don't feel at peace? How can you find peace in these areas?
