When the early Christians used the word "LOVE," they had something much more profound in mind.


GEEKING OUT ON GREEK





the means by which justice is satisfied and our sins are atoned for

For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood to be received by faith.



This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.




Now ask yourself... Where is the love? Where is the love?







"Nice" is an entirely unbiblical term. "He was nice" is what neighbors say to a reporter about the guy who just committed a heinous crime. "Nice" is a sign that we do not actually see people, but have instead dismissed them. Perhaps our deepest conversation has only been, "Hey, how's it going?" We may be nice, but we have yet to see the person. Nice is a dismissive term; the jargon of non-relationship.



Culturally...we are told to see everyone as nice and to be nice, but this is really a sinster slippery slope toward taking no one in the least bit serious. If we are only nice, we do not truly appreciate the other's uniqueness and potential blessing in my life. We just walk by with a shallow smile, wave, and nod.



If we are only nice, we take no interest in the story that has shaped their beauty, pain, and even ugliness. And, to our great shock, we discover that no one knows our story either. More does it seem they care. Our world is left to us desolate.


