
Romans 15:14

The Apostle Paul

Paul has been writing to a community of Jesus' followers living in Rome explaining God's gift of eternal life in Jesus, and how that gift of new life is supposed to be fleshed out in the way that we live.



5 May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, 6 that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.



7 Therefore, welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God....


Isn't Paul contradicting himself here? I mean, didn't he say earlier in Romans that there was no one who was good?

who seeks God.




"All have turned away, they have together become worthless; there is no one who does good, not even one."

The Doctrine of Total Depravity

Every aspect of human nature—mind, will, emotions, and body—has been corrupted by sin.

This corruption is so pervasive that no part of a person is untouched by sin's effects.

It does not mean people are as evil as they could possibly be (utter depravity), but rather that sin has affected the totality of our being.



What has happened to these Romans who were by nature totally depraved and now are "full of goodness"?

In a word, Jesus.

You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly.




"to instruct"

Literally "to place in the mind"










(equipped with spiritual understanding)


... able to instruct one another

As you come alongside one another to encourage and to instruct, remember to not just give good advice or thoughts for improvement. Always point each other to Christ!








Mercy Hill, your Christ-like character and your growing understanding of the gospel of Jesus enable you to come alongside one another to guide, counsel, and disciple one another.
