


I'm scared if I open myself to be known I'll be seen and despised and left all alone So I'm stuck in this tomb and You won't move the stone And the rain keeps falling



There's a woman at home and she's praying for light My children are there and they love me in spite Of the shadow I know that they see in my eyes And the rain keeps falling



Paul may intend "the Lord is at hand" to convey both truths: the Lord is near now by his Spirit, bringing aid in our sufferings; and he is coming soon in his glory, bringing suffering to an end.



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



"Pray without ceasing." What does this mean? Does it mean that you should do nothing but pray? No. It means you are to do nothing without prayer.




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

3 Essential Tools

- 1) Prayer
- 2) Thanksgiving

Supplication = "to plead humbly"

Prayer and supplication are closely related and interconnected as they are both forms of reverence and invocation to God. However, supplication is a type of prayer making them somewhat distinct. When we pray to request something from God, this is known as supplication, "to plead humbly."
