Isn't this proof that Jesus didn't physically rise from the dead, that his spirit lived on but not his body?

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."




Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe."




Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God."



The wound-marks remain on the resurrection body of Jesus Christ as a permanent reminder of everything he has done for our salvation. His hands and feet show the Father that he has paid the full price for sin. At the same time, they show us that our sins are fully forgiven.



In fact, the glorified wounds of Jesus show us the whole gospel. The marks on his body bear witness to the cross where he died. But his hands and feet belong to the same resurrection body that came out of the empty tomb.




These are the two great facts of the gospel: Jesus died, and then in the same body he rose again. These two facts give us the good news of our salvation: by the cross our sins are forgiven, and by the empty tomb we have the free gift of resurrection life.

The Gospel of Luke 24

41 And while they still disbelieved for joy and were marveling, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?"
42 They gave him a piece of broiled fish,

43 and he took it and ate before them.





They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear...to us who had been chosen by God as eyewitnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

44 Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."



One would have thought, since the Jerusalem sinners were the worst and greatest sinners— Christ's greatest enemies—and those that not only despised his person, doctrine, and miracles, but that a little before had their hands up to the elbows in his heart-blood, that he should rather have said, Go into all the world, and preach repentance


and remission of sins among all nations; and after that offer the same grace to Jerusalem; yes, it would have been infinite grace if he had said so. But what grace is this..., when it commands that this repentance and remission of sins, which is designed to be preached to all nations, should first of all be offered to Jerusalem, in the place of the worst of sinners!






Jesus of Nazareth, a man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through him in your midst, as you yourselves know—








Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified.

<u>Objection</u>


But I railed on him, I reviled him, I hated him, I rejoiced to see him mocked by others. Can there be any hope for me?

Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus, for the remission of sins, and you shall receive the Holy Spirit.


Oh! What a blessed 'every one of you' is here! How willing was Peter (and the Lord Jesus, by his ministry) to catch these murderers with the word of the gospel, that they should be made monuments of the grace of God.

...formerly I was a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. **But I received mercy** because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.






Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners — of whom I am the worst.

49 And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high.




The Holy Spirit is the Promised, Powerful, Personal Presence of God


Important Question







Understand that you have given me Narnia for ever, you have lost your own life and you have not saved his. In that knowledge, despair and die.






Let's join the long history of witnesses who testify about Jesus, crucified and risen from the dead.
