Whatever else John is going to tell us, he wants us to see his book as the story of God and the world, not just the story of one character in one place and time.



This book is about the **Creator God acting in** a new way within his much-beloved creation. It is about the way in which the long story which began in Genesis reached the climax the **Creator had always** intended.




And it will do this through 'the Word'. In Genesis 1, the climax is the creation of humans, made in God's image. In John 1, the climax is the arrival of a human being, the Word become 'flesh.'










John knows perfectly well he's making language go beyond what's normally possible, but it's Jesus that makes him do it.


