



There was an urgency behind Jesus' words. He was saying, "It is imperative that I come to your house."


Important Point

By placing this story about Zacchaeus here in his account of the life and teachings of Jesus, Luke is intentionally **contrasting Zacchaeus** to the rich ruler we had just read about.






Why does Luke record this encounter in his historical biography of Jesus? The good life is found in being found by Jesus, the One who came to seek and to save the lost


All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned –every one– to his own way....






Not only did Jesus come to seek and to save the lost, but he came to die for the lost and to reconcile us to God.


All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations....


