



27 There came to him some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, 28 and they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, having a wife but no children, the man must take the widow and raise up offspring for his brother...."

If brothers are living together and one of them dies without a son, his widow must not marry outside the family. Her husband's brother shall take her and marry her and fulfill the duty of a brother-in-law to her. The first son she bears shall carry on the name of the dead brother so that his name will not be blotted out from Israel.





#2: According to Jesus, marriage and the marriage bed are temporary things designed for this age to populate the earth.


Important Points to Understand




We make the wrong assumption that the power of God cannot make life in the age to come better or more pleasurable than it is right now.




I think our present outlook might be like that of a small boy who, on being told that the sexual act was the highest bodily pleasure should immediately ask whether you ate chocolates at the same time.




On receiving the answer 'No,' he might regard absence of chocolates as the chief characteristic of sexuality.


