





### The Son of Man

Jesus' favorite self-designation


Used over 80x in the Gospels

...behold, with the clouds of heaven there came one like a Son of Man, and he came to the **Ancient of Days** and was presented before him.




And to him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him;


#### **Important Question**

Jesus was truly innocent of all the charges against Him of being a seditious king leading an insurrection.

As the Christ, the Son of Man, and the Son of God, He is worthy of your allegiance and worship.

I am trying here to prevent anyone from saying the really foolish thing that people often say about him: 'I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God.'

That is the one thing we must not say.

A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic — on a level with a man who says he is a poached egg — or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice.

Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut Him up for a fool, you can spit at Him and kill Him as a demon; or you can fall at His feet and call Him Lord and God.








