If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation.




The Heavenly Father's love for us?


Bringing their thinking into line with each other wouldn't be any good if they were all thinking about something that was out of line with the gospel.

Actually, 'being in full accord' represents a single, rare Greek word, sympsychoi, which speaks of souls in harmony with one another. Our English expression soulmates, captures this wonderful word well.



It's as if Paul is saying, 'It is not enough to agree with each other theologically: God actually calls you to care for each other deeply, in a love that binds your souls together so strongly that differences of perspective cannot tear you apart.'



This strong bond of affection, grounded in the truth of the gospel, stabilizes believer's relationships with each other so that they can address their differences—whether doctrinal or interpersonal—in patience, humility, love.

In essentials, unity. In non-essentials, liberty. In all things, charity.

The real issue here is not if pride exists in your heart; it's where pride exists and how pride is being expressed in your life.






