FROM THE PREACHER'S PEN

Welcome

I am sure most people are aware of what it feels like to be in the pool of kids at recess and waiting to be picked for a team on kickball. As there numbers dwindle, our anxiety levels are rising. Even if you were one of the last to get picked and not the very last, there is this uneasy unwelcoming feeling on that team that gets stuck with you.

Be it at recess or the last to receive an invitation to a work party, or you name it, everyone wants to feel welcome. Everyone wants to feel invited and to know that we are not being a burden on another's kindness. In Asia, hospitality looks a lot different than what we see and practice in the Western World. The Taiwanese are extremely good at making one feel welcome.

In the ministry of Jesus, we find several times where He needed rest and withdrew by Himself or with His apostles. One such time is in Luke 9. Jesus has been training His disciples, and now it is their turn to go and practice what He has been doing. He even gives them authority to heal disease. No doubt this was an exciting time not only for Him, but for the 12 as well.

After they return the report is good. They have done what He has commanded them to do. To heal the sick, to tell people that the kingdom of God is near. This was probably the highlight of their ministry to this point, and when they come back Jesus knowing exactly what they need takes them away for rest.

Yet the crowd who is searching for Him, go and seek out Him and His disciples. Now Jesus taking on flesh means that He gets hungry and tired. It means that His energy has its limits and He needs to rest. After the crowd finds Him, Jesus has every right to say to the crowd please just give me 2 days or I just need a break from you for just a little while, let me eat something and take a nap and I will get back to you.

The interesting thing is that we do not see Him do anything of the sort. We see the very opposite, when the crowd sought Him, it says in Luke 9:11 He welcomed them. The Bible says that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. So the same One who welcomed the crowd 2,000 years ago, welcomes you today. You are welcome in His presence, you are welcome among His people.

JEREMIAH

The Prophets take up a large portion of the Old Testament, and for good reason. They are people sent by God with a message for His people. Sometimes, it was a good message, to keep on doing what they we're doing, to continue living the way they were, a message of encouragement. However, MOST of the time it was a message of judgment, of woe. The Prophet would declare that the way the people were living needed to stop, or bad things were going to occur... The people needed to repent, or disaster was on it's way...

Jeremiah is often called the weeping prophet. Why? Because no one would listen to anything he said... Constantly Jeremiah would call God's people to repent of their sin, but to no avail. They didn't care, they were so focused on doing whatever it was that they wanted to do, that it didn't matter what God said. They wanted to worship the false god of Baal. They were enamored by their sin.

Jeremiah 2:23-24, says this: "How can you say, 'I am not unclean, I have not gone after the Baals'? Look at your way in the valley; know what you have done---a restless young camel running here and there, a wild donkey used to the wilderness, in her heat sniffing the wind! Who can restrain her lust? None who seek her need weary themselves; in her month they will find her."

I know this verse sounds weird, but I think that is what draws me to it so much. So often we believe we are committed to the Lord, committed to His way, but all of a sudden something catches our eye, or in this instance, our nose... All of a sudden we sniff the wind, and we are right back to our old sinful habits before we even knew what hit us. The comparison Jeremiah makes of Israel being likened to a female donkey in heat is actually embarrassing just to read, but I think that's why it is so effective.

The imagery that Jeremiah brings forth in my brain of an animal in heat just driven here, there, and everywhere is an excellent example of what sin can do to us if left unchecked. The imagery is kind of funny at first, Jeremiah is likening Israel to a camel and a donkey. And then the thoughts of how Israel just can't get it right, they just won't listen, etc. And then for me to quickly remember that I can be just like Israel so very often... Then the comparison becomes much more real. Instead of me applying the female donkey in heat to Israel, I apply it to myself, and that's where the realization comes in. "God, I can be so easily distracted by the things of this world! Forgive me for running after anything but you!" God's Word is sharper than a double edged sword, and that verse, when you really think about it, cuts to the heart. If not careful, I can be drawn back into my old ways so easily. The words I say, the things I do, the places I go. We cannot forget what is most important!

Which leads me to the final verse I will share with you today: Jeremiah 2:32 says this: "Can a virgin forget her ornaments, or a bride her attire? Yet my people have forgotten me days without number." I got married to my lovely wife McKayla 7 years ago this De-

cember. I remember how important the wedding dress was. When it came to the material things needed for our wedding day, the dress was far and away the most important thing. There is no conceivable situation in which I could ever imagine McKayla showing up on our wedding day wearing anything other than her wedding dress! And this is the point Jeremiah is making: don't forget what is most important! Don't, like Israel, get so distracted by the things of this world that you forget all the great things God has done for you! Remember the most important, remember Jesus, and stop sniffing the wind!




tine crackers. Monetary donations are always welcome. We will be making our distribution on Thursday, Oct. 17th, if you are able to help see Jay Harsh.
