# THE MOVE to MIX

Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:5-6

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Matthew 6:33

In my last article for June, I asked for prayer for 3 major events for our youth throughout the summer. One of those big events was CIY MOVE. CIY holds a special place in my heart because it is where Jesus changed my life. We were registered to take a group of 12 (including adults) to CIY MOVE this year at Wheaton College in Wheaton, Illinois. Although I reached out to many students who could go, I just kept hitting a wall.

Nothing that I said or did seemed to help. It was like the more I tried to talk any student into going, the more I received reasons they couldn't go. The more I tried to talk it up, the more they turned me down. I was beyond frustrated, and I felt like CIY was just not going to happen. If I am being honest, I was leaning on my own understanding. I was trying so hard to figure out a solution to my problem. I had not given it to God. Which, I felt guilty for. Here I am always preaching and teaching to not lean on your own understanding, that when we trust in ourselves instead of God, we fail. Looks like I forgot to practice what I preach.

I was holding out hope for a few students that had given me a "maybe", to say they were going to CIY MOVE. I prayed and prayed that they would go, but I realize now it was not God's will. Finally, they reached out and said they would not be able to go, and my level of frustration hit its peak. I didn't know what to do. We had 12 spots with 2 deposits already down, we would lose all that money!

It was at that moment that I had almost given up hope, and then the Holy Spirit gave me an idea. What if we switched to CIY MIX? CIY MIX is a 4 day event for middle schoolers (6th-8th grade). Right now, our youth has a lot of students involved that are in this age group, especially kids just going into 6th grade from After School Xperience. Surely I could get a group of 9 of these kids to go on this trip, right?

But there were a lot of questions that went through my mind. With it being so short notice, would parents be willing to send their kids? Was there a week of MIX available that the dates worked for our schedule? Would the venue be close enough? Would CIY even allow a switch like this to happen? I realize now though, God was at work.

## **MOVE to MIX (con't.)**

There was a week of MIX that registration was still open for during the SAME WEEK that we were registered for MOVE. This venue was in Marion, Indiana. Even closer than Wheaton! Time and place were taken care of. Now all that was left was if CIY would approve the switch, and if the students would be willing to come.

I reached out to Joel, a friend of mine and contact at CIY, he told me he would look into switching our spots from MOVE to MIX, but that CIY did not typically allow that to happen. I didn't get my hopes up. I put it in God's hands. Joel said he would check into it, so I tried my best to just leave it go in my mind. Maybe God just didn't want us to take a trip to CIY this year. I was trying my best to prepare for that news. But that news never came.

I received a text from Joel a few days later that to his surprise, the switch was approved! We were on for CIY MIX 2024! My frustration turned to motivation, I couldn't wait to start asking kids if they wanted to go! Believe it or not, it wasn't 3 days before we had all 9 of those spots filled, plus one! When God is in the midst of something, things just happen! He is good!

Not only that, but the day after receiving that text from Joel, you all were so gracious at the CIY Brunch that we raised in total that day \$1,434 along with several committing to full scholarships for students to go to MIX!!! I could not believe it! That was a record day, by far!

Church, I say all that to say this, God is faithful. His plan is not our plan, and if we trust Him, if we put Him first, if we don't lean on our understanding, He will MOVE. The MOVE might be to MIX, but HE will MOVE. Many times He will MOVE in ways we do not understand in the moment. NEVERTHELESS, He is MOVING.

Now, I once again need your prayers. At this moment we have 10 students and 4 adults heading to CIY MIX from July 8th-12th in Marion, Indiana. Pray these students encounter Jesus in amazing ways. I believe they are supposed to be there, events were orchestrated in such a way that they could be! Pray that hearts would be opened, and they would know they are loved. Pray that they would choose to follow Jesus for the rest of their lives. Pray that God would MOVE at MIX.

# **Update from Kenzie Fountain's Mission Trip**

CRU has two programs in Gatlinburg that provide international students in college or students who are newly graduated with an opportunity to work in America over the summer. These students are either in danger in their home country or their home country does not provide fair wages or working conditions for them. This provides them with a safe place to stay and an ability to make money to pay off any debt they may have. Most students send money back home to help their families make ends meet as well.

I recently met one young woman from Jamaica who is here to create a better life for her 10 year old son back home. She sends portions of her paycheck home each pay period.

A lot of the countries that send students here are either a part of or very close to the 10/40 window. Their time here in America could be their only and last opportunity to receive the gospel in a place where they do not have to fear for their lives.

We don't acknowledge that we are missionaries to the students. We only aim to become their friends. Most of the students come here all alone, with no car, very little English, and no one to talk to.

Every Sunday night from 10-12, when most tourist shops close, we host a get together called "Gatlinburg United" it is "A time to get to know other college students and experience new cultures." We go out and walk with or pick up our international friends and take them to a small church located directly behind the "strip: (the tourist hot spot in Gatlinburg where many of the work). Here we play games. We have instruments around to teach each other songs from our cultures and childhoods. We also prepare a small meal for each student.

We are only a listening ear for the students if that is all that they want. Even if they deny the gospel, God still loves them and years for them to come home!

We have on particular game called "snapshot" this game looks like a regular deck of cards, but each card contains images that evoke specific emotions. We can use these cards to be simple and play matching cards, or even normal euchre. But we can use these cards to share our testimonies and to talk with each other about what our relationships with our creator looks like. Using these cards, the conversation often quickly turns from light and surface level, to what our deepest fears and any current hut might look like.

We have witnessed 2 people pray to receive Christ in the past 10 days. Thank you for your support and partnership in sharing the gospel.


