

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Philippians

(This is an article I wrote in the summer of 2021, but I felt it was just as applicable today!)

It's a VBS verse. A Sunday School verse. One of the verses you hear a million times growing up in church. "*Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice."* What does rejoice even mean? I don't hear many people saying the word, "rejoice" much these days. Dictionary.com defines rejoice as: to be glad; to take delight. Ok, the Bible tells us we should delight in the Lord! That makes sense. I understand that! However, the real translation is something like, "*Rejoice in the Lord when things are going great; rejoice when you feel like it!"*, right? Or maybe, "*Rejoice in the Lord when God answers my prayer the way I want Him too; rejoice when you're happy!"*?

God doesn't really mean for us to rejoice in all circumstances does He? Clearly whoever wrote this did not understand what hard times were... Did not understand what it meant to go through something difficult and continue rejoicing... Oh wait. Let's not get too far ahead of ourselves. The Apostle Paul wrote this verse, didn't he? And Church, can you tell me where he wrote it from? That's right, prison. Jail. And I don't mean cushy 2024 United States jail, I mean first century prison cell, chained to the wall, telling a scribe what to write for you, going to the bathroom wherever you could, no guarantee you were eating that day, darkness in a dungeon from dawn until dusk, jail. And now we realize again the importance of context to reading Scripture. How much more does it mean for us to read the words, *"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice."*, when we realize Paul says these words from this type of prison?

The hope he shows in Jesus, His Lord, the faith! And for him to go on in verses 5-9 to talk about how we shouldn't be anxious about anything is simply astounding. How could anyone take delight in anything while locked up in a prison cell? How could anyone be glad at a time like that? How could anyone rejoice during such immense pain and sorrow!? How? By putting His full trust in Jesus. Paul knew that no matter how bad things got, His God was the winner in the end. He knew that even if he died, he died for something that was more than worth dying for.

Church, I have to ask. Do we have that kind of faith? Do we have that kind of joy, peace, and trust in Jesus? I know for a fact that I do not at times. We like to put our God in a box, and take Him out on Sunday mornings to admire Him, when He should be the almighty Lord of our universe every waking moment of every

day. We can't even begin to comprehend His vast love, might, power, majesty, mercy, and strength. He is the GREAT I AM. The Creator, our Savior, the one for whom the angels sing all day and night, "*Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord God Almighty!"*. Ask yourself, do you worship Him like He is THAT God? Do you rejoice that you can go through struggles for Him? Or is He the God you put in the box and get out on Sunday morning?


