FROM THE PREACHER'S PEN

I would assume that all of us are pretty used to hearing bad news. We live at a time when bad news is what sells. For the reason, I try and not watch mainstream news media for the most part, with one exception, the evening news is where I get my information about what is going on in the world. The media, knowing that most of what it reports is bad, has a segment on every evening, focusing solely on good news.

How does the world respond when they hear bad news? Panic. Growing up in Louisville, KY we didn't see much snow in the winter. Every once in a while we would get some pretty bad winter weather. The result was pure panic. If you were lucky enough to make it to the grocery store within the hour of the announcement, you were probably one of the few that bought milk and bread. Milk and bread, even people who never drank milk or ate bread, when it was snowing, you had to have it.

What about more serious, more threatening bad news. When the doctor gives a grim report about the findings on the X-Ray? The company is downsizing and you are one of the ones they have decided to let go. When life is turned completely upside down on its head, how as Christians should we respond? With child-like trust. Psalm 112:7 speaking of those who know God, who love Him and are in a saving relationship with Jesus, says God's people are not afraid of bad news.

Bad news for the Christian should lead us to all that much more to put our trust in the One who is Sovereign, the One who works all things together for good for those who love Him, the One who promises never to leave you nor forsake you. If it was mere man asking to trust him in the midst of bad news, we should rightly be skeptical. Yet the One who calls us to trust, to continue to look to, is the One who created you. The One who knows and loves you. In times of trouble the born again child of God lives in an attitude of prayer.

Since we know the One who is in control, the One who is never surprised nor caught off guard, bad news should not shake us but move us to trust deeper in our Heavenly Father. For in this world that is filled with bad news from the time we awake to we lay down at night. Jesus is still the good news that brings peace and the hope of eternity with Himself.

We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. **Romans 8:22-23**

The last couple weeks my wife McKayla has been very busy. And you may think that business comes from the start of the school year, but unfortunately it does not. Recently, one of McKayla's former preschool students at Perry Christian Preschool began to have neurological problems. Her name is Everleigh. Everleigh's smile can light up the room, and she's just one of those kids that radiates joy. McKayla can tell you this. But Everleigh began to not be able to walk correctly for a time and exhibited other symptoms that were concerning.

Fast forward some time and this little girl, who has just turned five years old, has a tumor in the back of her head, a cancer that is not curable and not able to be operated on. She is given just months to live. This is why McKayla has been busy. When she received word that this was Everleigh's diagnosis, there was great mourning, obviously. This little girl, so full of life and with so much life left to live, will not be able to do so for much longer. This family, being robbed of their little girl way to soon.

This is why McKayla has been so busy. Her mourning continues, but it has been turned into a motivated mourning. How can we help this family? And so her and another teacher from PCP began to fundraise, making bracelets and t-shirts (Let me know if you'd like to buy either by the way!) that will make this time for this family just a little easier. Helping with events and anything else Everleigh's family may need. I have no doubt, if Everleigh's family needed something and McKayla could provide, it would be taken care of. Done. Never a second thought. (Yes, I say that because I am proud of my wife, but for another reason as well, we will get to that in a moment).

And then there's the Facebook posts by Everleigh's parents. Outside of the Bible, I don't know if I have ever read anything more inspiring. Everleigh's Dad, Matt and her Mom, Gina have written several Facebook posts since the diagnosis. The next one filled with more HOPE than the last! Yes, they are authentic about feeling the pain of inevitably losing their daughter in the future. But they are also unbelievably BOLD in proclaiming that THEY STILL HAVE HOPE. The message that God is Good even when this world is not shines through every single time. It is absolutely incredible.

Church, here is why I tell you all this. Sin is a terrible thing. It is the reason there is brokenness, disease, and death in this world. If you were to read Matt and Gina's posts, they will tell you that! Death in this dark world is something that is real. It isn't going away, not yet. But how does a family struck with this horrible news still have hope? It is JESUS!

Without Christ, without His Cross, Everleigh's parents have no hope of seeing their daughter again. But WITH HIM, hope comes back into the picture.

With Jesus, they can look their little girl in the eye and tell her confidently, "We will be together again." Not because of anything they have done, not because of anything we can do. But because of everything JESUS DID.

When we face trials, REAL TRIALS, and we still point to Jesus, there is no better witness for Christ. Matt and Gina have been handed some of the worst news parents can receive, and yet they still would affirm these things: God is good, it is Jesus who sustains them in the darkest of times, and He can sustain you just like He sustains them. Yes, even now when they face the deepest struggle, the hardest pain, they still want everyone else to know their Savior. What an example of faith!

The harsh reality we must all deal with is that we live in a broken world, a world that will not be fully healed until Jesus returns. That day is coming, but until then, Jesus heals our hearts. We do live in a broken world, but there is light for all to see when people like Matt and Gina stand for Jesus even when they don't fully understand why something like this is happening to them. There is light for all to see when Kingdom Workers like McKayla and others slap Satan in the face by choosing to be joy in the midst of deep sorrow, all for King Jesus. There is beauty in pain when Christians choose to stand for Christ EVEN IF the prayer they have been praying doesn't receive the answer they've been praying for.

Today, count your blessings, when you go through trials, TRUST JESUS. Please pray for Everleigh and her family, and allow the words of the song below sink into your heart and mind.
