FROM THE PREACHER'S PEN

David Hume the famous Scottish skeptic is probably known as the father of the argument from evil to disprove the existence of God. His argument was God is the benevolent and omnipotent creator. If such a creator exists, then there can be no evil. There is evil in the world. A benevolent and omnipotent creator does not exist. God does not exist. So does this deal the deathblow to the theistic worldview?

First let's look at the argument. It is true that God is good and He is the Creator of all things. Yet this is where the argument begins to fail, that since God exists there can't be any evil. How does this logically follow? Most would say because God is good and all powerful, He would have stopped evil before it began, or He would put an end to it now. In fact the whole argument rises or falls on this premise.

Since God is all good, and all powerful, then where does evil come from? The answer is rather simple. Freedom of the will! If freedom of the will exists, it logically answers the problem of evil in our world. How so?

One of the greatest gifts God gave to man is the freedom of the will. To dispute the argument of freedom of the will is actually self defeating, because you are using freedom of your will to argue against it. No one is forcing you to argue against personal freedom!

God knowing that we would use our freedom to commit acts of atrocity, gave us the gift in the first place so that we can commit acts of benevolence. Since we have been given this gift, some have abused the gift and committed evil acts. Yet we cannot fault God for abusing the gift he bestowed upon us, anymore than we can blame the car a young person gets for a present and drives drunk and kills someone. No one in their right mind would say it is the car or even the maker of the car's fault for this young person drunk driving and killing someone. So why are we so quick to blame the One who gave us free will when we are the ones who abuse that free will to commit evil. So we can restate the argument as follows There is an omnibenevolent, omnipotent God who bestows free will on his creatures. Those creatures choose to abuse the gift of God (free will) and commit acts of evil. Therefore God exists and

evil is a result of man's free will.

REFORMING OUR HEARTS

If you read 1-2 Kings and 1-2 Chronicles you will quickly find out that after King David and King Solomon, there are A LOT of evil kings that rule over Israel and Judah... Idol worship is rampant. Some even sacrifice their own children to false gods. At times it is total chaos. This is what happens when the One True God is not your One True King...

But there are a few good kings mixed in here and there. King Hezekiah and King Josiah to name a couple. King Josiah was just 8 years old when he began to reign in Judah, but the change he would bring about would be what would make his reign one of the most admirable. The changes he would enforce would cement his legacy as a king who put God first, and not himself first.

Things in God's people's history had gotten so bad, that they didn't even know where the book of the law was! Imagine so much sin, so much idolatry ruling for such a long time that a Bible cannot even be found! That is how much the nation of Judah had digressed... The Bible tells us that the book of the law is found in the 18th year of Josiah's reign as king. When he finds out what it says and how the people have been missing out on how they are supposed to be living, look how King Josiah responds...

When the king heard the words of the Book of the Law, he tore his robes. (2 Kings 22:11)

Then the king called together all the elders of Judah and Jerusalem. He went up to the temple of the LORD with the people of Judah, the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the priests and the prophets—all the people from the least to the greatest. He read in their hearing all the words of the Book of the Covenant, which had been found in the temple of the LORD. The king stood by the pillar and renewed the covenant in the presence of the LORD—to follow the LORD and keep his commands, statutes and decrees with all his heart and all his soul, thus confirming the words of the covenant written in this book. Then all the people pledged themselves to the covenant. (2 Kings 23:1-3)

Take a moment to read 2 Kings 23, you will see all the changes that King Josiah made, and how he was entirely serious about bringing the nation back to the Lord. The verse below summarizes perfectly the reign of King Josiah:

Neither before nor after Josiah was there a king like him who turned to the Lord as he did— with all his heart and with all his soul and with all his strength, in accordance with all the Law of Moses. (2 Kings 23:25)

Looking out over his kingdom, King Josiah saw the change that needed to be made, and he made it. Scripture doesn't tell us that he waited around for a few years or even that he consulted with some of his officials before making this decision. He knew that for the longest time God's people were not acting like God's people, and that needed to change, immediately.

When you look out over your life, are there any high places that need removed in your life? Any shrines or altars to false gods that need torn down, cut down, and ground into powder? (metaphorically or literally?!) Are the desires in our heart that we claim to be God's desires for our lives, really ours instead of His?

Israel and Judah both during this time in their history loved to worship both the Lord and other gods. One day worshipping the One True God, another day worshipping Baal. Church, I gotta be honest. I think we do the same thing a lot of times. We might worship the One True God on Sunday morning, but do we worship money, or things, or something else the rest of the week? Who really sits on the throne of our heart?

Does reform need to be made in your heart in the same way Josiah made reform in the nation of Judah? Way too many Christians just go with the flow, and praise God one day a week, don't be that kind of Christian. Worship the Lord always! He deserves it.
