I've been working with some of the other guys on our off time to do all the figuring and planning of materials and tools. He was able to get me the last of it yesterday so I've put everything in the included Word document.

I understand that there is limited time before the work team leaves in a few weeks and that may not give you the time you need. Anything that can be done would be a great help. I did a 2-minute video to briefly explain the project, the purpose of the tools, and the desire for help. Ezra, since you are coming on the trip and know your tools and this line of work, it seems best if you'd be able to take the information from the attached table and make decisions on the specific type of material or tool to be purchased. Each item is ranked in priority from high, to medium, to low in necessity to come for the project. There is also a section where there are notes, recommendations, and links to the type of material or tool we are after. I have also tried to research and give an approximate cost of each item. I've included Dad since he is leading the work team.

I'm including all of you so that everyone is in the loop and you all can coordinate in whatever capacity seems the best. If individuals wanted to give to a general collection for all the items that would be great. Since there is a breakdown of all the items, if it would be helpful for people to choose an item to cover the cost of that could be done as well. Whether things are purchased from one store, multiple stores, or online is up to you all. I will be available for any questions that come up. Again, I'm sorry this was not able to be given to you earlier. Thank you for your willingness to try to help.
