This is where local believers are taught how to properly read and understand the Word of God and share it with others, (either as a pastor, evangelist, Sunday School teacher or counselor). There were twenty-four graduates who received a certificate and a brand new study bible. Two radio employees were amongst the graduates, Patricia and Jean-Baptiste.

Hope Radio had a visitor the other day. Moussa came to Hospital of Hope from about 150 miles away for surgery on his broken tibia. He's a Muslim but has been listening to Hope Radio since the first day he arrived at the hospital. He was surprised to call Hope Radio and learn that the radio station was in Mango! He visited the radio station one afternoon and very much enjoyed the visit. Adam Drake was able to pray for him and Moussa said he's going to listen to the station regularly. Pray for his heart to open to the gospel and his healing to go well.





Patricia, our secretary and chaplain to the women at Hope Radio started recording the book Portraits of Women in the Bible! This will be life changing for so many women in desperate need of this wisdom. Please continue to pray for this outreach to the women in the Hope Radio audience.
