

Despite over 50 years of a thriving church in Dieki, Bankim, Banyo and other regions, there remains a glaring void among the indigenous people. It is a story where the Gospel has made progress among Anglophones but struggles to penetrate the lives of the Francophone (Tikari, Banyo and Bamoun indigenes), who are predominantly Focus, rural and steeped in idol worship. The time has come for a dedicated Missions team to rise to the challenge and bring the light of the Gospel to these underreached parts of Cameroon.

Unveiling the Reality: In the diverse landscape of Cameroon, the disparity in the spread of the Gospel is evident. The Francophone areas have seen limited progress compared to their Anglophone counterparts. Recognizing this crucial need, The Navigators ministry in Cameroon has established a
