Discussion Questions:

- Is there anything you learned in this passage that seemed new to you?
- How does this passage better inform your understanding of who God is?
- How do the truths revealed about God in these passages help shape the way believers should live in light of the Gospel? Explain.
- As Christians, how can we connect the truths we've learned from this section of God's Word and faithfully communicate them to a non-believer? What key points would you focus on, and how would you guide them toward the Gospel?
- Mill Creek, how can this text guide our church community and foster a positive impact on our local body? Considering our whole church, What does an appropriate response look like in reference to the Scripture and sermon?

Application Questions:

- The passage ends with the ultimate example: "Even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (verse 45). How does Jesus' own life and sacrifice challenge or change the way you think about success, greatness, and leadership?
- Jesus gave His life as a ransom for many because He came "not to be served but to serve." Who is one person God has placed in your life that you could serve this week in a practical way—no spotlight, no reward expected? What might that look like, and how could it reflect the heart of Jesus?
