Sermon Discussion Questions

Nahum 1:2-8

- Reread or review the passage together.
- Read through the sermon outline together.

Discussion Questions:

- What stood out to you from Nahum 1:2–8? Was there anything that surprised you or helped you understand God more clearly?
- Nahum shows that God is jealous for His people and does not ignore evil. How does that truth challenge the way we sometimes think about injustice?
- Verse 3 says, “The LORD is slow to anger and great in power.” Why is it important that God is both patient and powerful?
- Nahum 1:7 says, “The LORD is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble.” What does this teach us about God’s care for His people?
- The sermon emphasized that God’s justice and goodness do not contradict each other. How do we see both of these truths come together at the cross of Jesus?
- How would you explain the message of this passage to someone who struggles with the question, “If God is good, why does He allow evil?”

Application Questions:

- What would it look like this week to “take refuge” in the Lord rather than trying to handle fear, guilt, anger, or pain on your own?
- Who in your life needs to hear that God sees injustice, does not forget evil, and offers refuge through Jesus? How could you gently encourage them with that truth this week?
- How can Nahum 1:2–8 shape the way we comfort those who are hurting, warn those who are careless, and point people to Christ?
