- I. Format
  - A. Times New Romans
  - B. 12 pt. Font
  - C. Double spaced
  - D. 1-2 pages, typed

### II. Introduction

- A. This paragraph includes general information, such as the author and the title of the book, as well as the book genre (fiction, biography, historical fiction, etc.)
- B. The introduction should include your thesis statement, which reveals your attitude toward the book and gives the main ideas in your review. The thesis statement also gives your evaluation of the book (favorable or unfavorable) and your reason for giving such an evaluation.

## III. Body

- A. The body of the paper is a short, concise summary of the book.
- B. The body of the paper should support the thesis statement.

#### IV. Conclusion

- A. Restate the thesis statement in the conclusion
- B. The conclusion should sum up your opinion of the book.

#### V. Grammar and Mechanics

- A. Grammatical errors
- B. Spelling, punctuation, capitalization, etc.
