We continue this week in the season of Lent. Lent is the season of the church year that recalls Jesus' suffering and atoning death for us and calls us to renewed repentance. Lent lasts for 40 days (not counting Sundays) and leads up to Good Friday and Easter, the remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.

Father, help us to be ready to celebrate the great paschal mystery. Make our love grow each day as we approach the feast of our salvation.

Friday Psalm 31 | Jeremiah 11.1-17 | Romans 6.1-11 | John 8.33-47

Merciful Father, fill our hearts with your love and keep us faithful to the gospel of Christ. Give us the grace to rise above our human weakness.

Saturday Psalm 32 | Jeremiah 13.1-11 | Romans 6.12-23 | John 8.47-59

Lord, make this lenten observance of the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ bring us to the full joy of Easter.

NEW CITY CATECHISM

Q27: Are all people, just as they were lost through Adam, saved through Christ?
