Part-Time Position (~30 hours/week)



Church Overview

New City is a healthy, growing congregation in the Presbyterian Church of America. Comprised of about 720 adults and 470 children we are located in Cincinnati, OH where we have committed ourselves to connecting people to God, to community, and to mission. We want to ensure all we do is faithful to the kingdom of God and in line with [our mission, vision, and values](#). Culturally our church is warm, winsome, and oriented around the means of grace in order to remind ourselves of God's deep love. We act out what we believe through the practices of hospitality, serving our community, and praying and caring for our neighbors.

When New City started in 2009 there was one child in our little church family. Fast forward 12 years and many children later, the church recognized a need for a youth ministry, launching New City Student Ministry in 2021. Since then, the ministry has grown from 10 teenagers, 6 volunteers, a youth pastor, and a part-time administrator to 50 students, 20 volunteers, and one youth pastor. NCSM is a highly relational driven ministry with a large group worship service and small groups taking place on most Wednesday nights. The goal of NCSM is three-fold: 1) equipping students with a biblical worldview that makes sense of their lives, 2) connecting students with older mentors in the church, and 3) helping students become active participants in the vibrant community of God's people at New City.

Position Overview

The Student Ministry Intern will report to the Pastor of Family Ministries and will be responsible for building and supporting a dynamic student ministry for 7th-12th graders. This position will work closely with the Pastor of Family Ministries and to plan and execute weekly youth meetings (i.e., Large Group), socials, retreats, and other student ministry programming, including necessary administration and communication with parents, volunteers, and students.

Responsibilities

- Creatively pursue and maintain relationships and fellowship with youth. One-on-one and small group relational ministry will be instrumental in this area.
- Communicating with parents and students about meet-ups, events, and summer activities
- Participate in all summer programming
- Assist the Youth Ministry staff in the preparation for and execution of the summer youth activities
- Participate in weekly staff meetings with the Youth Ministry staff.
- Assist the Youth Ministry staff in planning, coordinating, and scheduling youth activities. Provide administrative and creative support in appropriate areas.
- Participate in and serve the church's Sunday morning worship gatherings and kids programs. Encourage student participation in Sunday morning worship gatherings.
- Work with Staff and other leaders to incorporate students into larger church life.

Qualifications/Competencies

- Must be a committed, mature, growing Christian with a consistent personal prayer and devotional life
- Must be able to work well in a collaborative ministry atmosphere
- Displays humility, servant leadership, and adaptability
- A desire to develop ministry gifts in the service of the local church
- A curiosity for discovering what working in a church might look like as a life calling



Compensation

- Pay: Summer interns will be paid a stipend that reflects their level of experience.
- Ministry Expense Account: Summer Interns will have an expense account that will cover all ministry expenses.
- Lodging: Summer interns will have lodging provided with one of our church families (if needed).
