### II Samuel | Room #11

*Teacher: Ken Veer*

The book of II Samuel is a continuation of the events of David's life after the death of Saul until close to the end of his life. There are many times of trusting in God, but also times of struggle and sin. David's life demonstrates both the benefits of walking with God and the devastation that come from sin. These accounts of how God interacted with David and others will provide valuable lessons to apply to our lives.

### Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross! | Room #12

This line from a familiar hymn might serve as a title for the spring quarter class. There are two major events that highlight the calendar of many churches. Celebration of the Advent is fresh in our minds---having been observed only a few weeks back. Looking forward to Spring might conjure up in our minds more mild temperatures and green grass. However, to the follower of Christ, nothing is more significant in the rites of Spring than to experience the joy of Easter...and not only is there much joy which characterizes this event...but one can also relish the display of power which Easter demonstrates. Many specific events lead up to the crucifixion of Christ and to the victorious and dramatic resurrection which followed. Often, we let that be the story and ignore some of the personal struggles which Christ willingly endured. It will also make the story complete to discuss the Ascension of Christ following the resurrection. Several scriptures from the Gospels and from the Psalms and Isaiah will be consulted as we attempt to make the Easter observance more real and thoroughly referenced.

### Come and See/Basic Bible Doctrines I01 | Room #13

This is a series of 50 classes that comprise 60 classes in all, that will be studied one at a time each week. These courses will help class members to gain a broad -based overview of critical theological subjects of the Bible. Studied in the progressive topical fashion presented, each lesson contributes toward a biblical foundation essential to the spiritual growth and maturity of the believer in Messiah Yeshua. Each person in class will have to read a manuscript on the Ariel Ministries website and will be provided with a test for each session (no costs). It will take 5-6 quarters to complete, but we will take breaks from time to time. The classes will be from a literal-historical-grammatical and dispensational approach. Each class explores a basic foundational doctrine of the Bible. These are the foundational doctrines that every believer should receive once they have believed in Yeshua for their salvation but seldom receive.

### The Nature and Working of the Holy Spirit | Room #14

In this class we will study the Third Person of the Trinity. We will trace the biblical accounts of Him in the Old and New Testament. We will examine His ministries, His titles, and His deity. We hope to increase in our knowledge of the truth and better worship God for who He is.

### The Gospel of Matthew | Overflow

This class is a study in the book of Matthew focusing on Jesus as the Messiah and the fulfillment of OT prophecy. We will try to cover the entire book over two quarters.
