#### NBC 101 | Room #12

#### Come and See/Basic Bible Doctrines 101 | Room #13

This is a series of 50 classes that comprise 60 classes in all, that will be studied one at a time each week. These courses will help class members to gain a broad-based overview of critical theological subjects of the Bible. Studied in the progressive topical fashion presented, each lesson contributes toward a biblical foundation essential to the spiritual growth and maturity of the believer in Messiah Yeshua. Each person in class will have to read a manuscript on the Ariel Ministries website and will be provided with a test for each session (no costs). It will take 5-6 quarters to complete, but we will take breaks from time to time. The classes will be from a literal-historical-grammatical and dispensational approach. Each class explores a basic foundational doctrine of the Bible. These are the foundational doctrines that every believer should receive once they have believed in Yeshua for their salvation but seldom receive.
