The Gospel of Mark | Room #11

As we continue our study in Mark's gospel, we will see Christ continuing His miracles and teachings while resolutely making His way to the cross. We will continue to pay special attention to Christ's teachings and also see how He methodically unveiled His deity through word and deeds.

Come & See: Bible Basics 101 | Room #13

The class will be a continuation of Come and See. ***Anyone can join at any time in that there is a different subject each week, except for a few two-part classes. If someone wants to join, they may want to contact Gary before they join because they will need to know there is a reading assignment, online, and a test that goes with the reading.***

These courses will help class members to gain a broad -based overview of critical theological subjects of the Bible. Studied in the progressive topical fashion presented, each lesson contributes toward a biblical foundation essential to the spiritual growth and maturity of the believer in Messiah Yeshua. Each person in class will have to read a manuscript on the Ariel Ministries website and will be provided with a test for each session (no costs). The classes will be from a literal-historical grammatical and dispensational approach. Each class explores a basic foundational doctrine of the Bible. These are the foundational doctrines that every believer should receive once they have believed in Yeshua for their salvation but seldom receive.

The Book of Isaiah | Room #14

Have you studied the fifth gospel? No, it's not a heretical part of the apocrypha, it's what the early church fathers called Isaiah, and no wonder since it references the Messiah over 100 times. From prophecies of Jesus's birth at the beginning to foretelling his death at the end, Isaiah is quoted more in the New Testament more than any other book besides Psalms. Whether you are partial to stories, prophecy, or poetry, Isaiah has some of everything. We won't be able to cover every chapter this winter but come join us for the high points.

New Testament Character Studies | Room #12

Hebrews 11 provides a "Hall of Faith" for many Old Testament characters. We don't have any equivalent list for New Testament characters, yet they demonstrated similar faith in God. As we dive into the lives of these New Testament people, we will see how their faith impacted their actions. They were human and faced many of the same struggles as we face, yet they set an example of how our lives can have an impact for God's glory. We will not be reviewing the life of Jesus but will look at many other men and women who can offer examples of how to live by faith.

The Book of Acts | Overflow
