Know God's Astonishing Grace

We believe the Scriptures are given by inspiration of God to be the rule of faith and life. If you are able, we invite you to stand in honor of God's Word.

The Spirit makes the reading and preaching of God's Word a powerful means of nourishing and comforting God's people, and awakening people to new faith.

After the Scripture reading, children ages 4-8 are dismissed to go to Promiseland, our children's church program. Experience God's Astonishing Grace

Communion, or the Lord's Supper, is a symbolic meal for Christians. As part of our preparation to receive the bread and the cup, we profess our hope in Christ out loud. We join with Christians throughout history and the world in making such a profession.

In his Last Supper before crucifixion, Jesus commanded his followers to "do this in remembrance of me." The broken bread and the cup represent Christ's broken body and shed blood for the sake of our salvation. By partaking of the bread and cup, you are proclaiming hope in this salvation and, by faith, enjoy fellowship with Christ (see 1 Cor. 10:16). The bread and cup are signs and seals of God's covenant promises to forgive our sin and make us new in Christ.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds; God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made.

Who, for us and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits on the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge the living and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end.

Getting to Know the Catechisms of the Church

The Westminster Larger (WLC) and Shorter (WSC) Catechisms are useful tools for the church. They summarize essential truths taught in Scripture. Each week we highlight different questions and answers. Let these brief summaries assist you to delight in God's works and study them more closely.

WLC Q. 100. What special things are we to consider in the Ten Commandments?

A. We are to consider, in the Ten Commandments, the preface, the substance of the commandments themselves, and several reasons annexed to some of them, the more to enforce them.^p

WLC Q. 101. What is the preface to the Ten Commandments?

A. The preface to the Ten Commandments is contained in these words, *I am the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.*^q Wherein God manifested his sovereignty, as being JEHOVAH, the eternal, immutable, and almighty God;^r having his being in and of himself,^s and giving being to all his words^t and works:^u and that he is a God in covenant, as with Israel of old, so with all his people;^w who, as he brought them out of their bondage in Egypt, so he delivered us from our spiritual thralldom;^x and that therefore we are bound to take him for our God alone, and to keep all his commandments.^y

p. As an example, Eph. 6:1–3. q. Ex. 20:2. Cf. Deut. 5:6. r. Isa. 44:6. s. Ex. 3:14. t. Ex. 6:3. u. Acts 17:24, 28. w. Gen. 17:7. Rom. 3:29. x. Luke 1:74–75. Gal. 5:1. y. 1 Pet. 1:15–19. Lev. 18:30. Lev. 19:37.

When we consider the Ten Commandments it might be easy to skip over the preface as if it adds nothing. The Larger Catechism, however, highlights how important the preface is to our understanding of the commandments. The words of the preface are, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery" (Ex. 20:1, ESV). The Catechism touches on four truths from this preface.

First, God revealed himself as the LORD. This word with the small capitals comes from God's self-revelation to Moses in the burning bush (Ex. 3:14). Calling himself "I AM WHO I AM" God communicates that he is "the eternal, immutable, and almighty God; having being in and of himself; and giving being to all his words and works." This self-revelation gives weight to the commandments he is about to give.

Second, God is a God in covenant. By identifying himself as "your God," God is recalling the promise he made to Abraham in Genesis 17:7, "I will establish my covenant between me and you and your offspring...to be God to you and to your offspring after you." Our relationship with God is not dependent on our obedience to a list of commands but upon God's faithfulness to his covenant. He has promised to be our God.

Third, God has delivered his people from slavery (bondage, thralldom). God says, "I brought you out of the house of slavery." The Exodus was the defining event in the life of Israel in the Old Testament, and it was a type or foreshadow of what God would do through Jesus on a spiritual level (Is. 61:1-3 with Lk. 4:17-21). Paul says in Galatians 5:1, "For freedom Christ has set us free."

Fourth, as a response of gratitude and worship, we take him for our God alone and aim to keep his commandments. It is in the context of the sovereign covenant of God and the redemption he has accomplished in Christ that we hear and heed the commandments.
