#### FOR YOUR REFLECTION

The builders of the tower of Babel choose to make a name for themselves in opposition to God rather than embrace the name that God gave them. In Augustine's terms, they turn away from the "common" good of the love of God and embrace the "private" good of self-love. They seek to define their own reality, their own understanding of success. But Babel is not an isolated event, as its biblical metamorphosis into "Babylon" indicates. Babel stood—and still stands today—as a type of the earthly city, in rebellion against God. The famous painting of the Tower of Babel by Pieter Bruegel the Elder (c. 1563) weaves together motifs from throughout human history, including the Roman Colosseum, to show that the Babel instinct is ever present in fallen humanity.

# **Know God's Astonishing Grace**

We believe the Scriptures are given by inspiration of God to be the rule of faith and life. If you are able, we invite you to stand in honor of God's Word.

# Getting to Know the Catechisms of the Church

The Westminster Larger (WLC) and Shorter (WSC) Catechisms are useful tools for the church. They summarize essential truths taught in Scripture. Each week we highlight different questions and answers. Let these brief summaries assist you to delight in God's works and study them more closely.

#### WLC Q. 31. With whom was the covenant of grace made?

A. The covenant of grace was made with Christ as the second Adam, and in him with all the elect as his seed.

#### WLC Q. 32. How is the grace of God manifested in the second covenant?

A. The grace of God is manifested in the second covenant, in that he freely provides and offers to sinners a Mediator,<sup>z</sup> and life and salvation by him;<sup>a</sup> and requiring faith as the condition to interest them in him,<sup>b</sup> promises and gives his Holy Spirit<sup>c</sup> to all his elect, to work in them that faith,<sup>d</sup> with all other saving graces;<sup>e</sup> and to enable them unto all holy obedience,<sup>f</sup> as the evidence of the truth of their faith<sup>g</sup> and thankfulness to God,<sup>h</sup> and as the way which he has appointed them to salvation.<sup>i</sup>

WLC 30 gave us the good news that God does not "leave all men to perish in the estate of sin and misery," but he "brings [his elect] into an estate of salvation by the second covenant, commonly called the covenant of grace." The following questions help us understand the Covenant of Grace.

First, Question 31 tells us that the covenant of grace is made with Christ. Just as Adam was appointed as a representative for the whole human race in the covenant of works, so Jesus is the representative for all those who will be saved in the covenant of grace (see Romans 5:15). This is good news, because only the unique God-man, Jesus Christ, can fulfill "the righteous requirement of the law" (Rom. 8:4). As we are "in Christ" by faith, we also receive the benefits of the covenant of grace.

Question 32 gives us a big picture of the blessings (i.e. "grace manifested") of the covenant of grace. Perhaps bullet points will help distinguish the blessings:

- God gives Jesus as a Mediator between himself and sinners.
- Life and salvation come by the Mediator.
- God requires faith as the means to receive the Mediator's work but also gives the Holy Spirit to work that faith in all his elect.
- God enables his elect "unto all holy obedience," which is evidence of their genuine faith and thankfulness.

In other words, God the Father *plans* the work of redemption through the covenant of grace. God the Son *accomplishes* the work of redemption through his work as Mediator (WLC 36ff will unpack this truth). And God the Spirit *applies* the work of redemption into the lives of the elect (WLC 58ff will unpack this truth). It is called the "covenant of grace" because everything for our salvation is provided by God's gracious work.
