Know God's Astonishing Grace

SCRIPTURE READING - Genesis 29:31-30:24

³¹ When the LORD saw that Leah was hated, he opened her womb, but Rachel was barren. ³² And Leah conceived and bore a son, and she called his name Reuben, for she said, "Because the LORD has looked upon my affliction; for now my husband will love me." ³³ She conceived again and bore a son, and said, "Because the LORD has heard that I am hated, he has given me this son also." And she called his name Simeon. ³⁴ Again she conceived and bore a son, and said, "Now this time my husband will be attached to me, because I have borne him three sons." Therefore his name was called Levi. ³⁵ And she conceived again and bore a son, and said, "This time I will praise the LORD." Therefore she called his name Judah. Then she ceased bearing.

Know God's Astonishing Grace

After the Scripture reading, children ages 4-8 are dismissed to go to Promiseland, our children's church program. If you are visiting with us, you are more than welcome to escort your child downstairs to see the classroom and meet the teacher. Of course, you are also welcome to have your children sit with you through the service.

¹⁴ In the days of wheat harvest Reuben went and found mandrakes in the field and brought them to his mother Leah.

Then Rachel said to Leah, "Please give me some of your son's mandrakes." ¹⁵ But she said to her, "Is it a small matter that you have taken away my husband? Would you take away my son's mandrakes also?" Experience God's Astonishing Grace

Communion, or the Lord's Supper, is a symbolic meal for Christians. As part of our preparation to receive the bread and the cup, we profess our hope in Christ out loud. We join with Christians throughout history and the world in making such a profession.

In his Last Supper before crucifixion, Iesus commanded his followers to "do this in remembrance of me." The broken bread and the cup represent Christ's broken body and shed blood for the sake of our salvation. By partaking of the bread and cup, you are proclaiming hope in this salvation and, by faith, enjoy fellowship with Christ (see 1 Cor. 10:16). The bread and cup are signs and seals of God's covenant promises to forgive our sin and make us new in Christ.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The Belgic Confession, Articles 20-21

What do you believe about the work of God?

We believe that God – who is perfectly merciful and also very just – sent his Son to assume the nature in which the disobedience had been committed, in order to bear in it the punishment of sin by his most bitter passion and death.

And what do you believe about the work of Jesus Christ?

We believe that Jesus Christ presented himself in our name before his Father, to appease his wrath with full satisfaction by offering himself on the tree of the cross and pouring out his precious blood for the cleansing of our sins, as the prophets had predicted.

Why did he endure all this?

He endured all this for the forgiveness of our sins.

What comfort does this give you?

We find all comforts in his wounds and have no need to seek or invent any other means to reconcile ourselves with God than this one and only sacrifice, once made, which renders believers perfect forever.

Getting to Know the Catechisms of the Church

The Westminster Larger (WLC) and Shorter (WSC) Catechisms are useful tools for the church. They summarize essential truths taught in Scripture. Each week we highlight different questions and answers. Let these brief summaries assist you to delight in God's works and study them more closely.

WLC Q. 80. Can true believers be infallibly assured that they are in the estate of grace, and that they shall persevere therein unto salvation?

A. Such as truly believe in Christ, and endeavor to walk in all good conscience before him, may, without extraordinary revelation, by faith grounded upon the truth of God's promises, and by the Spirit enabling them to discern in themselves those graces to which the promises of life are made, and bearing witness with their spirits that they are the children of God, be infallibly assured that they are in the estate of grace, and shall persevere therein unto salvation.

WLC Q. 81. Are all true believers at all times assured of their present being in the estate of grace, and that they shall be saved?

A. Assurance of grace and salvation not being of the essence of faith, true believers may wait long before they obtain it; and, after the enjoyment thereof, may have it weakened and intermitted, through manifold distempers, sins, temptations, and desertions; yet are they never left without such a presence and support of the Spirit of God as keeps them from sinking into utter despair.

These two questions go together as they both address the issue of assurance of salvation. Q80 asks if true believers can be assured they are saved. The short answer is "yes." The fuller answer explains what that assurance is based on. First, our assurance is "grounded upon the truth of God's promises." Just as we do not save ourselves, we also do not "keep" ourselves. We trust in God. Second, the Spirit enables us to discern in ourselves "those graces" tied with our salvation. "Those graces" include the understanding of spiritual things (1 Cor. 2:12), keeping of his commandments (1 Jn. 2:3), and love for the brethren (1 Jn. 3:14). True believers can be assured of their salvation.

Q81 is a pastoral issue. Is assurance of salvation permanent for all believers? The short answer is "no." The longer answer starts by stating that assurance is not "of the essence of faith," that is, assurance is not a component of receiving and resting in Christ alone for salvation. Assurance comes after faith and may be "weakened and intermitted." The Catechism lists several causes that affect our assurance: "manifold distempers, sins, temptations, and desertions." These include, of course, our own sinfulness and God's providential "desertions." Jesus uses the words of Psalm 22:1 to express this feeling of desertion, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

The last line of the answer is key: "yet are they never left without such a presence and support of the Spirit of God as keeps them from sinking into utter despair." We hear God the Redeemer speak in Isaiah 54:8, "In overflowing anger for a moment I hid my face from you, but with everlasting love I will have compassion on you." The contrast is stark: his anger is but for a moment, chastising us in our sin, but his love is everlasting, preserving us for eternal salvation. Therefore, even if you lack assurance of salvation, do not lose sight of the truth of God's promises. You stand by his grace.
