"Paul's Journey Through God's Story" Acts 20:36-21:26 Rick Carmickle

1. Paul's journey included great suffering. (20:36-21:6)

Paul endured suffering in his ministry with "tears and with trials" (20:19) and he knew that in every city "*imprisonment and inflictions await*" him (20:23). When leaving his Ephesian friends in Miletus, (never to see them again), there was much "weeping on the part of all; they embraced Paul and kissed him, being sorrowful most of all because . . . they would not see his face again" (20:37-38).

When leaving the believers in Tyre, Paul and his friends "knelt down on the beach . . . prayed and said farewell to one another" (21:5-6).

Paul suffered hardships during his journey, but he knew his (P) suffering was for the greater purpose of sharing the gospel.

3. Paul's journey was a single desire to pursue God's plan against all opposition. (21:10-16)

Agabus, a prophet, warned Paul of the dangers of going to Jerusalem. Paul's other friends begged him not to go. But Paul had an answer:

"Then Paul answered, 'What are you doing, weeping and breaking my heart? For I am ready not only to be imprisoned but even to die in Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus, ' ¹⁴And since he would not be persuaded, we ceased and said, "Let the will of the Lord be done." (21:13-14)
