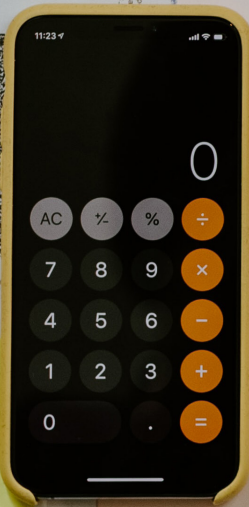

Stephen Ministry



Stephen Ministry is a worldwide ministry in which Christians minister to anyone experiencing a difficult life situation with a goal of pointing the receiver to God. Stephen Ministers do not advise but instead listen, support, and pray for their Care Receivers. Men minister to men and women to women, and is strictly confidential. Stephen Ministers initially commit for two years including training and may renew their commitment for as long as they feel called to the ministry.



Training - 50 hours of weekly sessions for about 6 months; training class convened every other year

Individual meeting with Care Receiver about one hour per week

Meeting with other Stephen Ministers twice monthly (1st and 3rd Tuesday evenings at 7pm)

Preschool



Preschool



Peace Preschool is a play-based, half-day preschool run on a traditional calendar. We emphasize exploration and learning through play, and we also provide developmentally-appropriate academic training designed to prepare children for Kindergarten as they get older.

Our school accommodates 70 students and fourteen teachers divided into four classes: a two-year-old class (Noah's Doves), a three-year-old class (Daniel's Cubs), a four-year-old class (Peter's Fish), and a transitional Kindergarten class for five-year-olds (Solomon's Horses).
