Sermon Notes

Gideon: From Worrier to Warrior

Judges 6:1-10

The Common Cycle for Each Judge

- 1) **Apostasy:** The Israelites do what is evil in the sight of the Lord.
 - 2) **Servitude:** God allows the nation to be conquered and oppressed by a neighboring nation.
 - 3) **Supplication:** The people cry out to God; and
 - 4) **Salvation:** God sends a judge to deliver the Israelites.
- The cycle repeats after the judge dies.**

Apostasy in Judges

Apostasy: The Israelites turned away from God, worshipping Baal and Asherah.

Consequences: Their disobedience resulted in severe oppression and suffering. They cried out to God for deliverance.

Prophetic Warning: God sent a prophet to remind them of their disobedience and to call them back to faithfulness. (Judges 6;7-10)

The Great Awakening

Spiritual Decline: Prior to the Great Awakening, there was widespread spiritual apathy, and a move towards rationalism and secularism.

Consequences: This led to a lack of genuine faith and a sense of spiritual emptiness among the people.

Revival: Preachers like Jonathon Edwards and George Whitefield called people to repentance and a personal relationship with God, and a great revival.

Apostasy in the Modern Church

Apostasy: Many churches today face issues of declining membership, moral compromise, and the influence of secular ideologies. A focus on cultural relevance, not doctrinal purity.

Consequences: This has led to spiritual lukewarmness, and a lack of transformative power in believers' lives.
