#### **Biblical Passages:**

Women: 1 Corinthians 14:34–35: "The women should keep silent in the churches. For they are not permitted to speak, but should be in submission, as the Law also says. If there is anything they desire to learn, let them ask their husbands at home. For it is shameful for a woman to speak in church."

1 Timothy 5:9–10: "Let a widow be enrolled if she is not less than sixty years of age, having been the wife of one husband, and having a reputation for good works: if she has brought up children, has shown hospitality, has washed the feet of the saints, has cared for the afflicted, and has devoted herself to every good work."

*Men*: 1 Corinthians 16:13–14: "Be watchful, stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love."

Titus 2:2, 6: "Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness...urge the younger men to be self-controlled."

Marriage: Ephesians 5:32: "This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church."

*Everyone:* 1 Corinthians 6:13b: "The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body."

1 Corinthians 7:4: "For the wife does not have authority over her own body, but the husband does. Likewise, the husband does not have authority over his own body, but the wife does."

#### In Their Own Words:

I. Howard Marshall claims, "But in the Western world today expectations have changed. Many husbands and wives see one another as equal partners, and one-sided subordination of the wife to the husband is seen as inappropriate and is not demanded. Does Christian teaching to new converts require the imposition of a relationship of subordination that was previously not present?" Marshall continues, "The positive elements in Ephesians are to be characteristic of both partners: a mood of subordination in which each partner subordinates their own interests to their spouse's, the motivation of sacrificial love in which each partner strives to help the other achieve the sanctification that is God's will for them, and the consciousness that this loving relationship is the nearest thing on earth to the relationship between Christ and the church."

#### In Their Own Words

Tom Horner writes (on Romans 1), "But we are wrong to try to pin down one meaning for 'nature' in Paul. We cannot; for there seem to be almost as many meanings as there are uses."

Christine E. Gudorf, commenting on 1 Corinthians 6:9, writes "What seems to me the most fruitful method for approaching the question of the status of homosexual acts is not to argue over how to translate certain imprecise words in the Greek New Testament, but to investigate how the condemnation of homosexuality accords with the scriptural witness in general."

The 2000 Baptist Faith and Message, Article XV (on The Christian and the Social Order) states, "In the spirit of Christ, Christians should oppose racism, every form of greed, selfishness, and vice, and all forms of sexual immorality, including adultery, homosexuality, and pornography." Compare Article VI (on The Church)?

Sam Allberry writes, "When an idol fails you, the real culprit turns out to be the person who has urged you to worship it—not the person who has tried to take it away."

Anita Worthen and Bob Davis write, "Some parents fall into a double standard. They minimize the problem when their son at college is spending nights at his girlfriend's apartment, then they have a fit when their daughter is sleeping with another woman...God looks at all sex outside of marriage as displeasing to him and damaging to the persons involved."

- (1) Andreas Köstenberger and David Jones, *God, Marriage, and Family: Rebuilding the Biblical Foundation*. 2<sup>nd</sup> edition. Wheaton, IL: Crossway, 2010. One of the best Christian and conservative resources on marriage, divorce, and parenting.
- (2) Robert A. J. Gagnon, *The Bible and Homosexual Practice: Texts and Hermeneutics*. Nashville: Abingdon, 2001. Tom Schreiner at Southern Seminary calls this book "the definitive and convincing work on homosexuality." Gagnon's book is comprehensive in scope (500 pages). Köstenberger and Jones's book above includes a more concise look at homosexuality.
- (3) S. Donald Fortson III and Rollin G. Grams, *Unchanging Witness: The Consistent Teaching on Homosexuality in Scripture and Tradition*. Nashville, Tennessee: B&H Academic, 2016. A comprehensive treatment of the biblical passages and historic Christian teaching on homosexuality. This book is a "heavy" tome but is an excellent and authoritative resource.
- (4) John Piper and Wayne Grudem, eds., *Recovering Biblical Manhood and Womanhood: A Response to Evangelical Feminism*. Wheaton, IL: Crossway, 1991. This book provides discussion on key gender passages plus several chapters on modern issues and applications.
- (5) Andreas J. Köstenberger and Thomas R. Schreiner, eds., *Women in the Church: An Interpretation and Application of 1 Timothy 2:9–15*. 3<sup>rd</sup> ed. Wheaton, IL: Crossway, 2016. More technical discussion of an important passage in the Bible on men and women in the church. The authors, though, make the technical discussions readable for a wide audience. It provides a window into how exactly Christian scholars can debate on the smaller details of Scripture.
- (6) John F. Kilner, ed. *Why the Church Needs Bioethics: A Guide to Wise Engagement with Life's Challenges*. Grand Rapids: Zondervan, 2011. Discusses many ethical issues, some of which relate to gender.
