SONG: Turn Your Eyes

Quote & Question:

"The love of [idols] cannot be expunged by a mere demonstration of [their] worthlessness...the heart cannot be prevailed upon to part with the world, by a simple act of resignation...The only way to dispossess [the heart] of an old affection is by the expulsive power of a new one."

"Thus it is, that the freer the Gospel, the more sanctifying is the Gospel...this is one of the secrets of the Christian life, that the more a man [sic] holds of God as a pensioner, the greater is the payment of service that he renders back again.

On the tenure of 'do this and live,' a spirit of fearfulness is sure to enter...and the creature striving to be square and even with his Creator, is, in fact, pursuing all the while his own selfishness, instead of God's glory...It is only when...acceptance is bestowed as a present, without money and without price, that the security which man feels in God is placed beyond the reach of disturbance...the one party rejoicing over the other to do good, the other finding that the truest gladness of his heart lies in the impulse of gratitude, by which is awakened a new moral existence."

Thomas Chalmers, The Expulsive Power of a New Affection

If you were going to put these very old quotes in your own words, how would you say them?

If you were going to make a map of your own heart can you connect the dots between things you cherish, what you love, and what you worship? Can you talk to God about that?

If Chalmers is right then our problem is not that our disobedience is too real to hide (it is), but that Jesus is not real enough. How might Jesus need to make himself more real to your heart for you to grow and change (As King, as Lover/Desire, as Provider/Sustainer)?
