ON THIS SPECIAL DAY — Of Pastor Matthew's installation as the Senior Pastor at Pleasant Street Church, we've set out several symbols in our worship space. They represent various aspects of Pastor Matthew's work among us:

- The *bowl and towel* symbolize the role of a pastor as servant. Pastors are called to follow after their Lord who knelt and washed his disciples' feet.
- The *cup* and plate remind us that a pastor leads us in the sacraments. Just as Jesus gathered his disciples for a meal, pastors help us gather at Jesus' table; remembering his suffering, tasting his glory, and longing for his return.
- The *Bible* symbolizers the role of pastor as preacher. Pastors help us to know God's story both in scripture and in our lives.
- The *robe and stole* represent our role as priests to the world. Pastor Matthew's robe reminds us that we too have been dressed like Jesus and sent out in the world as priests.
