BE NOT AFRAID — This year we've seen the rise of a global pandemic, job loss and economic depression, and overwhelming prophetic anger at injustice in the world. This, not even to mention, the uncertainties and hard losses that have touched our lives this year.

The people living in Darkness have seen a great light. This year we are people who know something about living in darkness; darkness like the kind that Isaiah is describing. We are a people who also know the fears that accompany living in a land with little light.

This Sunday, we begin the season of Advent, a season of waiting for lesus to come back and to bring all the glory of a world made new with him. And Advent begins in the dark, where fears loom large and people long for light. As we wait during the four Sundays of Advent, we will offer up our fears to God and hear the bright, surprising news that comes when angels appear with Good News to those in the dark and to people living in fearful times: "Do Not Be Afraid". We will not be alone. We will wait with Zechariah who hears good news he cannot fathom and learns to hope again. We will wait with Mary who is surprised by news that will change her life and her body forever. We wait with Joseph who is told that he must go down in reputation in order to do God's will, not up. We will wait with the shepherds who in the dark are overwhelmed by an angelic host. In the dark of our own fears, in the silence of our own suffering, in the longing for hope we cannot imagine, we will wait with them for those first words of good news that change everything: "Do not be afraid, the Lord has heard your prayer." loin us as we wait for The Dawn.
