"...I suggest that most of the Psalms can only be appropriately prayed by people who are living at the edge of their lives, sensitive to the raw hurts, the primitive passions, and the naive elations that are at the bottom of our life. For most of us...entry into the Psalms requires a real change of pace. It asks us to depart...the world of public survival, to move into the open, frightening, healing world of speech with the Holy One." Walter Brueggemann, *Praying the Psalms*.

What are your questions about the above quote? Do you understand what he means? What would it look like to move into the "open, frightening, healing world" in your conversations with God?

Most of our words happen during the middle of the day - radio, music, emails, conversations. But I wonder - when you wake up, what are the first things on your mind/heart? When you are ready to sleep, what are the things left on your mind/heart? What would it be like to pray those morning & evening thoughts? Are they different from the middle-of-the-day words?
