SONG: We Will Remember

Quotes & Questions:

"Our lives always move between the pit and the wing, between the shattering of disorientation and the gift of life. That is what our baptism is about — to die and to rise with him to newness of life (Romans 6:1-11).... Every man, woman, and child of us has been within and shall again face the pit, and this must be brought to speech. Every one of us has the wings assured to us (Deut. 33:27), and that also must be spoken about.

...the Psalms...give us new eyes to see and new tongues to speak. And therefore we need not enter the Presence of the Holy One mute and immobilized. We go there to practice our vocation of receiving the new future God is speaking to us..."

Walter Brueggemann, Praying the Psalms, p. 41

Psalm 30 shows us the pattern of the Christian life is movement between dying and rising. When was a time where God moved you from pit to wing, or from death to life? Was it new life in a dead relationship, or a new reason to live in the world? Was it healing for an old wound? Or renewed intimacy with Christ? Have you ever told that story to someone? Who might be someone in your life who could benefit from a story like that?
